# Superior Stamina Wins the Day

For two quarters Torrens and North Adelaide fought a desperate and even battle on the Thebarton Oval today. Torrens were a little bit lucky to leave the arena at half-time with a seven point lead. In the third term, the gold and blue eighteen established a distinct superiority, and, improving as the game progressed, won comfortably. In the concluding stages, North seemed to lose confidence, and a struggle, which gave promise of a stirring finish, ended tamely.

### The Players

For Torrens it is difficult to pick the best performer. Mills, in the first half took some sensational marks and kicked four goals, but in the second half he was quiet, and Marvell assumed the role of star forward. Both these men did much to bring success to Torrens. Karney and McCarthy both played dashing and effective games, and Lock, though essentially a defender, did well up forward. Hine, playing in goal, kicked the wonder-

fully well, and played with nice judgment, while Osborn was easily the pick of the defence. Minear, Adams, Fleet, and Brown all did fairly well, and, in fact, there was not a really weak man on the gold-and-blue side.

For North Munn stood out. His marking at half forward was sensational, and the fact that he kicked five goals speaks for itself. Furler and McDorald on the centre were among the pick of the redand-white eighteen, and Townley and Low marked well at times. Low, however, wastes many opportunities by doing inexplicable things when in possession. He has a had habit of kicking into the man on his mark. Thomas, Kinnear, Morris, and Wallace were the best of the others, while Conrad, though obviously still feeling the ill effects of an ankle injury, did fairly well.

## GLENELG FIGHT HARD

### Fourth Victory for Norwood

Flushed with three successes Norwood met Gleneig at the Norwood Oval this afternoon, confident of achieving their fourth victory.

Torpy and Exley stood out of the Bay team.

Light showers fell before the players took the field. Umpire J. Quina had charge of the game.

Norwood, winning the toss, kicked to the pavilion end. but Glenelg went forward immediately, through the agency of Lloyd and C. Hill, and the ball was in Norwood territory. Tilbrook was awarded a free, but the ball fell short. Away went the redlegs round the wing. Lee marked nicely. Wadham secured, and raised one flag with a long angle shot.

Again Lee fowarded, and drove the bail well down. Johnson, picking up from a scramble, notched a minor.

Handby defended well.
