## Norwood Hold Fourth Place From Port By Narrow Margin

The sensation of today's league football was the narrow victory of Torrens After having outplayed the Thebarton team for three terms, West, with 17 men, had victory snatched from them in the last minute.

Torrens thus won their seventh game for the season, six of them being by a margin of seven points or less.

Port, with a 68-point victory over South, greatly improved their percentage, and failed to displace Norwood from fourth position on the premiership list by the barest of margins.

At Prospect North and Norwood figured in a game of few outstanding features, neither side showing form. North won by 15 points. Farmer's eight goals for North cements his position at the top of the league goalkicking list. making his total 56.
