

GLENELG, STURT, NORWOOD, TORRENS WIN FOOTBALL

REDLEGS SECURE PLACE IN FINAL FOUR

NORTH'S SURPRISE DEFEAT IN THRILLING FINISH

West Fail to Open Winning Account

(CONDUCTED BY "HIGHFLIER")

By a convincing victory over West at the Norwood Oval today, Norwood secured fourth place in the final four. Better system and a definite superiority in the air enabled the redlegs to win by a big margin. West have gone through the season without scoring a victory.

As a result of defeat by Glenelg, in a thrilling finish at Prospect, North fell from second to third position. The Bay side came with a last-term burst to snatch victory in the last few minutes of the game.

Sturt's forwards produced their best form for the season against Port at Unley. It was the efficient work of this section that was the deciding factor in the defeat of the Magpies.

Torrens recorded a comfortable win over South in a hard but unspectacular game at Thebarton. South played well with the wind behind them, but could make no headway in the other two quarters. Torrens go up into second place because of North's defeat.

Farmer, the North full-forward, created a record by taking his tally for the season to 104 goals—the fourth season he has kicked more than 100.

Port won the association premiership by defeating Torrens convincingly at the Adelaide Oval.

WIN ON THE BELL BY GLENELG

After having been outclassed by North, Glenelg snatched a last-minute victory at Prospect. North were superior in almost every department in the first half, but Glenelg recovered brilliantly.

Towards the end of the last quarter Glenelg gained the lead for the first time, and although North regained it Glenelg continued their overwhelming burst, and won on the bell.

Farmer scored seven goals and brought his tally to 104 for the season. This is the fourth successive year that he has reached the goalkicking century.

North won the toss, and a strong wind enabled Martin and Hemers to quickly score a goal each with long kicks. Foulis was a last-minute withdrawal because of influenza, and North had to reshuffle the team. Foulis' place was taken by Chapman, and Smart was brought into the team as nineteenth man.

Farmer had been watched closely by Curnow, but from a mark in front the North forward scored full points. After falling, C. Rosewarne (Glenelg) brilliantly goaled, and Farmer did likewise with a kick off the side of his foot.

Furler resting in a forward pocket, scored another soon after. Johnston (Glenelg) had so far dominated the ruck, but the North half-forwards and half-backs were far superior. The Glenelg players were continually straying from their positions, and North were beating them to the ball and in the air.

McInnes and Hemers (North) and Link (Glenelg) added goals before the quarter ended.

Owens, who had been very quiet, missed an easy chance. From a brilliant overhead mark Farmer shot for goal from a sharp angle and the ball bounced in front. It bounced away from Curnow, who was on his own, and dribbled through the goal-posts.

The players and spectators cheered Farmer, who had scored 100 goals in each of four successive seasons.

Goals came from Chapman (North) and Owens and Goldworthy (Glenelg). It was the Glenelg captain's first goal. Furler, who was resting in direct opposition to Owens, had given him few chances.

Taylor and Barrett helped to form a most formidable defence. Goldworthy added Glenelg's sixth goal.

Goldworthy, who had been playing well at half-forward wing, and Brock, at centre half-forward, changed places after half-time. Glenelg's defence had improved, but brisk play gave Farmer a chance, and he scored his fifth goal.

Glenelg had begun to stage a big improvement, and Link's well-judged kick put them within three goals of North. But Farmer secured another for North. Colyer (Glenelg) was unlucky to have his shot touched after a brilliant run.

From a free to Owens a few yards in front a goal resulted. Colyer was now one of Glenelg's best. North had slowed down with a comfortable lead, but Furler and Mackay helped to clear numerous Glenelg attacks.

Goals by Owens and C. Rosewarne placed Glenelg within five points of North. Cornelius with another gave them the lead for the first time for the match. It was only momentarily, however, as Furler soon scored a goal.

Munn cleared two Glenelg attacks from just in front, and then Colyer added a point. R. Rosewarne gave Glenelg the lead once more. Mackay then left the field.

Farmer and Smart added goals quickly for North, and Goldworthy replied with full points for Glenelg. Developing excellent system North swept forward, but vigorous play turned them back.

Just on the bell Goldworthy added a goal, and Glenelg had won by four points.

Over 100 Goals Four Seasons In Succession

FARMER'S RECORD



Ken Farmer, North's star full forward, was given a fine reception at Prospect today when he kicked seven goals, taking his total for the season past 100 for the fourth consecutive time.

Farmer's seven goals today bring his tally to 104 so far this season. He holds the Australian record of 126 goals in a season, made in 1931. It seems unlikely that he will better that feat this year.

Farmer's record since he started with North in 1929 is as follows:—

The goal with which Farmer scored his century for the season today was a lucky one, but it followed a brilliant overhead mark in a crush.

The ball, kicked at a sharp angle, bounced in front of goal, and its twist tricked Curnow and it dribbled through. The spectators and players were quick to recognise that football history had been made, and roundly applauded Farmer.

Today's Football Stars



SALLIS was the main figure in Glenelg's victory over North. He sustained his brilliance at centre from start to finish, and his clever play towards the end started many Glenelg attacks.

MUNRO, the South full forward, failed against Torrens to kick the seven goals he needed to eclipse the club goalkicking record of 74 made by G. Margitich, who is now in Melbourne.

JOHNSTON, with his high marking and good ruck play, was outstanding for Glenelg. He was one of the few Glenelg players to shine in the air. Colyer was quiet at first, but was at his best towards the end of the match.

It was a successful move by Glenelg to move Goldworthy from a half-forward wing to centre half-forward after half-time. He added two valuable goals in the last quarter, one of them giving Glenelg victory.

TAYLOR was one of North's best at centre half-back. He played a large part in North's decided superiority in the first half.



FURLER, playing in defence for North, effectively subdued Owens, who kicked only three hard-earned goals. With Taylor, Melvin, Barrett, and Munn, Furler made up an almost impassable line of defence in the early part of the game. It was unfortunate for North that Furler was out of defence in the last quarter, when Glenelg scored seven goals.
