

# Norwood Beat Port for Third Time This Season

## Torrens Fight Back Strongly

**SOUTH SURPRISED BUT SCRAPE HOME**

## Glenelg and West Win

For the third time this season, Norwood beat Port at Norwood today in the last round of matches before the major round begins. Port finished 41 points in arrears. Scores:

Norwood, 18-19 (127 pts.); Port, 12-14 (86 pts.). South, 19-12 (126 pts.); Torrens, 17-18 (120 pts.). Glenelg, 15-20 (110 pts.); Sturt, 16-12 (108 pts.). West, 20-26 (146 pts.); North, 13-9 (87 pts.).

South and Torrens—the other semi-finalists—met at Thebarton. Fifty-five points down at the end of the first term, Torrens plugged away grimly and finished only a goal behind South.

West trounced a listless North side at the Adelaide Oval. Hudson kicked 10 goals for West and Farmer nine for North. Glenelg just managed to hold Sturt off long enough to win by two points. It was their third success for the season.

## SURPRISING VIGOR IN NORWOOD MATCH

Three more goals in succession by Goodwin, Reilly, and Lush gave Glenelg a comfortable lead.

Fighting back vigorously, Sturt completely turned the tables and goals came in succession from Smith (2) and Zucker. Goodwin kicked his third goal for the term to give Glenelg a 17-point lead at the change.

Goodwin, Brock, Robjent, and Johnston were dominating key positions for Glenelg, but Sturt generally were a little faster on the ground and surer in the air.

Winkler goaled early in the second term. In a sustained attack Sturt scored goals from Biggs, Treleven, Biggs and Hardy to take the lead by five points. Hall swung the advantage back to Glenelg with a goal.
