The Gleneig forwards invariably stood flat-footed, and did not attempt to give a semblance of a lead. Neither did their smaller men attempt to gather the ball in, as it fell from the hands of the pack.

North would have gone further ahead but for the brilliant play of Keane at centre half-back. He stopped and marked everything that came his way.

On two occasions he started two of his team's best pieces of play from half-back when he tore down the centre to pass the ball to a half-forward, who in turn shot it into the goalmouth where Owens and Crabbe managed to kick straight.

Alan Burton was North's best back man and he broke up a great number of Gleneig attacks on the goal line.

Corbett and Crabbe rucked strongly for Glenelg throughout. Their knocks from the bounce were a wasted effort, because of the slowness of their rovers to gather in the ball. These rovers strangely enough, showed a great deal of pace in the open and played good football.
