Crabbe, for Glenelg, always held his own in the ruck, and was given good support by Owens and Haussen, who shared the roving.

Owens also showed plenty of dash and courage, and was often under notice for clever play.

Glenelg opened with rafe speed and dash. Showing brilliant teamwork, they had North floundering, and held them goal-less in the first quarter.

Lowe, Masters, and Hunt, in defence, played outstanding football, and with their centre line holding its own, Glenelg looked set to win their first match for the season.
