Gallagher, at centre and Foweraker on the opposite flank, completed Norwood's centre-line strength, and in individual clashes the honors were with the redlegs.

After a scratchy opening by both sides, Norwood led at quarter time, and were never headed.

Way, in the second quarter for Norwood, playing in a forward pocket, kicked three goals, the result of good marking, and strong and forceful ground play. At half-time Norwood led by 22 points.

The third quarter was Glenelg's best. Three quick goals put them within three points of the redlegs, and Norwood got a shock.

Betson, Keane, and Hunt did good service for Glenelg in this burst.

Leading by 17 points at the last change, Norwood quickly put the issue beyond doubt, and added 4—2 to 1—4 to win by 33 points.
