

# Glenelg And Port Only

## Forwards Star in Glenelg's 73-Pt. Win

The Glenelg Oval match was interesting as an example of how to play and how not to play in the forward lines.

Glenelg was the master of the forward section to the tune of a 73-point win and West Adelaide a very ragged and, in this instance, dull pupil.

West matched Glenelg well in the first quarter, but in the second term Glenelg virtually won the game by scoring 6.1 to 1.3 to lead by 37 points at half time.

Most impressive was the manner in which Glenelg scored these second quarter goals.

The first five came after players had marked and steadied themselves; the last from a 50-yard drop-kick by Davies after a run which left opponents flat-footed.

West, on the other hand, almost ran round in circles in attack.

Statistics effectively reveal West's forward weakness. Ten players shared in its scoring shots. The selected full forward Stewart, was so ignored that he scored only one goal—and that kicked off the ground—until moved to centre after half time.

West scored only two goals in about 1½ hours, but then, in about two minutes (and from set shots), it scored the other two late in the third quarter.

But by this time Glenelg was in irresistible scoring mood. It kicked eight goals in the second half to West's two.

Then West capped a dismal forward display in its goalless last quarter.

A West forward took a pass and, looking farther ahead, saw a team-mate in the goal square about 25 yards away. He aimed at this man—but the punt screwed out of bounds.

Glenelg's steadily brightening hopes seem to lie in its forward line, and Alf Bailey at centre.

West rucks were not particularly formidable but more than matched their Glenelg counterparts for most of the game and the Glenelg defence was solid without showing brilliance.

But in the forwards, Churchett was at his elusive best. Hall a constant menace when resting in a pocket, Davies a dynamo of energy at half forward and a steady supplier of long, raking kicks, and Guy a cool and unselfish position player. They had the advantage of being "fed" well and often by Bailey.

The rovers, Wickham and King, also made many opportunities in the forward open spaces.

# Unbeaten Teams

Port Adelaide, out-lasting West Torrens in a test of condition at Thebarton, and Glenelg, giving further evidence of its improvement by swamping West Adelaide at Glenelg, are the only undefeated league football teams.

In Saturday's bright autumn sunshine, with little wind and perfect underfoot conditions, teams produced fast, vigorous football.

Norwood drew further attention to the fact that, thanks to the merit of its recruits, it has not lost the lee-way generally expected. It convincingly defeated North Adelaide by 33 points.

Sturt kicked nine goals in the last quarter of its match against South Adelaide to record 24.24 (188) its highest score since 1940.

On July 20, 1940, it defeated Glenelg at Unley Oval—29.17 (191) to 11.11 (77).

An interesting match in next Saturday's series will be at Alberton between Norwood and Port Adelaide.

Glenelg will seek to preserve its unbeaten condition by defeating Sturt at Unley—a test of the improvement Sturt showed last Saturday.

West Adelaide and South Adelaide will meet at Adelaide Oval and North Adelaide will endeavor to break through at the expense of West Torrens at Prospect Oval.
