

Season's second tied game today

League football had its second draw for the season with the Glenelg-Sturt game at Glenelg today.

West and Torrens drew at Thebarton on May 12 in the fourth series.

On Monday, Sturt defeated Torrens by one point.

There was one other close game today—West's defeat of Norwood by 13 points at Adelaide Oval.

Norwood got to within seven points with eight minutes to go, but West finished better.

North comfortably defeated Torrens at Prospect by 31 points, while Port—as expected—thrashed South by 100 points.

Today's highlights included:—

● Port's eighth successive win. Their winning margins this season have been 95 points, 39, 65, 37, 75, 12 (against West), 109 and today's 100.

● Wally May's inspiring last quarter for Sturt against Glenelg.

● Bill McKenzie's four goals for North which gives him a lead of 12 goals in the goalkicking list.

● Continued brilliance of Ron Ashby, Torrens' and State half-back flanker.

Sturt come back

In the game at Glenelg, the home team led well at half-time, but Sturt, playing much better in the second half, hit the front with four minutes to go.

With one minute left, Glenelg equalised with a point and were attacking on the siren.

Davies and Slattery had a lot to do with Glenelg's 20-point lead at half-time and 10-point lead at three-quarter time.

At Prospect, North, keeping State full forward Mick Clingly to one goal, had their forwards working with much more purpose at the other end of the ground.

Small men won
Vic Johnson, The Sun-

day Mail's chief football writer, says West's small men won them the game at Adelaide, although Norwood won in the air.

At Alberton Oval, South at one stage got to within two points of Port, the league leaders by five premiership points.

But Port streaked away then.

Fos Williams and Geoff Motley, carnival representatives, each got five goals, while Port's third rover, Jim Sawford, kicked four.

Bays in four

In the premiership list West (11 points) and North (10) continue their battle for second position.

Glenelg, by getting one point for their draw today, take fourth position following Norwood's defeat.

With the carnival in Perth next week the State Second 18 will provide the game—against the Victorian League club team, Essendon at Adelaide Oval.

In Perth, SA will play WA.

Glenelg, Sturt draw game

Sturt, trailing for most of the day, finished brilliantly to play a drawn game against Glenelg at Glenelg Oval today.

Glenelg's surer ball handling under heavy conditions gave them the advantage almost throughout.

With Rundle kicking accurately in front of goals they seemed to have the game well in hand.

Trailing by 10 points to begin the last term Sturt kicked four goals and hit the front. They then staved off Glenelg, who were attacking persistently, for a hectic five minutes.

With scores equal, May marked repeatedly on the last line for Sturt and returned Glenelg's attack. He was still keeping Glenelg out when the siren sounded.

Both teams had a good spearhead at which to aim their attack.

Caust missed far too many when right in front, although kicking five goals, while Rundle must get special praise for his six.

Potter captain

Glenelg derived a lot of their drive from the centre bounces and through Edwards on a wing, while Sturt's drive came mainly from their big men.

Brian Potter, Glenelg, playing his hundredth game, was elected captain in the absence of Crabb and Wilson, and tossed for ends with May. May won the toss and chose to kick towards the northern goal. There was no breeze.

Donkersley and Wilson withdrew from the Glenelg team with leg injuries, Chisholm and Murphy going into the side with Wickham and Milbank reserve. Murphy went on a wing, with Slattery taking Wilson's berth as a rover.

Sturt, combining better and teaming effectively, immediately raced into attack and although the Glenelg backs defended

stoutly, Sturt registered goals to Caust and Lane.

Rundle came to the rescue and scored two quick goals to keep Glenelg in touch with Sturt.

Bays miss

Potter was continually left unattended in front of goals and should have had four goals instead of two.

At the end of the first quarter scores were Glenelg 5-2, Sturt 2-5.

Slattery, roving well to the intelligent knockouts by Davies, snapped a goal to put Glenelg further ahead, but Hocking, racing into an open goal, also goaled for Sturt.

Glenelg continued to gain momentum from rovers Longman and Slattery, but attack after attack was rebuffed by spirited defensive work from Sturt.

Kicking astray

Lane left the field and was replaced by Ross.

Sturt had most of the play in this term, but inaccurate shooting for goal still kept them behind Glenelg's score.

Half-time scores were Glenelg 9-5, Sturt 5-9.

Played hard

Glenelg began the second half with a fast break-away from centre, but a foolish pass by Davies when in shooting distance found Longman scrambling for possession, and he could manage only a point.

Glenelg's plan to play the game hard, especially against May, misfired, as Umpire Hall penalised any foolish pranks.

Strong-man Freundt, who always make the ball his objective, rattled on two goals for Sturt, but Glenelg posted one from Slattery.

Sturt fight

Leahy, driving in well from half-back, found

Rundle in front for Run to kick his fifth goal.

In this vital third quarter Sturt came back at Glenelg, and although their shooting for goal was astray they outscored Glenelg for the quarter.

Third quarter scores were Glenelg 12-6, Sturt 9-14.

Sturt were getting drive from their rucks. With the last quarter beginning and Sturt trailing by only 10 points all looked set for a tight finish.

Four points separated the teams as Caust goaled but Rundle did likewise to put Glenelg 10 points ahead again.

Sturt, finishing full of running, added another three goals in as many minutes and they set up a lead of nine points.

Scores were soon equal with Glenelg hotly pressing goalwards.

It was all Glenelg, with Sturt defending stoutly. May, stationing himself at full back, held Glenelg up until the siren.

Final scores were: Glenelg 14-10 (94 points), Sturt 13-16 (94 points).
