But North used the steamroller

With the stage set for a good finish at three-quarter time, North steam-rollered Glenelg in the last term to run out comfortable winners by 49 points.

Glenelg had the use of a good five-goal breeze in the last term, but with North making every post a winner they were never able to get into stride.

Forced to go into ruck following the last-minute withdrawal of Alwyn Faggotter, Brian Gambling turned in a terrific game for the Roosters.

His fair and slightly balding head bobbed up all over the field as he time and again came in contact with the ball, either gaining possession in the crushes or taking a firm grip of it in the air.

His last-quarter effort, playing a loose man in defence, was a gem, and he completely crushed any Tiger hopes of victory.

As much to do with the easy win, perhaps, was the move of Don Lindner to full forward and Pascoe to centre half-forward midway through the third term.

Fine burst

Glenelg were defending stoutly at this stage, and North did not appear to be gaining enough ground to face the last quarter against the breeze with any confidence.

Pascoe was immediately freed and kicked a long goal. Then Lindner, in a brilliant burst of high marking, kicked two goals, and North were quickly out of trouble.

Gilbourne won the toss and North kicked to the Glenelg end with the breeze.

From the first bounce it

was all North, with Barbary brilliant on a wing, Bubner taking the knocks, and Trenorden and the rovers streaming downfield to give the forwards plenty of opportunities.

Two goals off the ground from Pascoe and Whitford, and a 60-yarder from Barbary sandwiched between them gave North a great start.

The Glenelg defenders were not backing up, and North always had a man moving to an open space where he could shoot for goal unmolested.

Richens worked tirelessly around the fringes to send Glenelg forward many times, but the North half-back line was equal to the challenge, and playing well in front of their opponent's, they launched many successful attacks.

When Glenelg did get past the half-back line they ran up against the rock-like defence of Gilbourne and Hank Lindner, who did as they liked.

North added three more goals for the term, and missed many easy shots.

Just as the first term was North's, the second was just as easily Glenelg's.

They got on top across the middle and sent the ball time and again into the forward line only to see it sent straight back from the boot of a North defender.

Perseverance was rewarded, however, when Heron kicked their first goal from a free. Rowett had a brilliant burst and quickly added two more—the second following a fine mark over Gilbourne.

Glenelg lacked the for-

ward method of the Red-and-Whites and many promising scoring opportunities were wasted.

Finally, it was left to Don Rewett to show the easy way to get goals as he twice drove through the middle from near the centre of the ground.

Leading 10 points at half-time, North could not get going in the early part of the third term.

Herron playing a loose man across half-back, turned out everything North threw against him and his game lifted the rest of the Glenelg defenders.

They tore into the game fiercely, and the "runner" became almost a fixture on the field as North's position became desperate.

Then came the Lindner-Pascoe switch, and North supporters showed their relief at the goals that followed.

Whatever chance Glenelg had was quickly crushed in the last term when Lindner goaled again and Gambling came into his brilliant best.

Kernahan finally goaled for the Tigers, but this was answered with three more from the powerfully finishing North side, to one from Richens.

Gambling was best for North with a grand effort throughout.

Barbary won his wing all day, and much of his ball handling was freakish to watch.

Herron tried his utmost to do a job that was too big for him alone, while Hewett never gave in and gained more value from his kicks than did his immediate opponent.
