The more experienced Bay side started well and finished with a shade more steadiness, but the youngsters and newcomers to this nerve-wracking opening game.


Although beaten by nine points, the Panther camp was quite cheerful about their showing, and if their confidence continues to rise, they will be a headache for the higher-rated teams.
