# STURT, NORTH SET FOR CLASH

LIFT-OUT

With clear-cut wins today Sturt and North retained their two game break at the top of the premierships ladder to set the stage for a tremendous battle at Adelaide Oval next Saturday.

The brilliant long-kicking styles of both teams should draw a great crowd to see North try to repeat their first game success and topple the Blues from league leadership.

Today Sturt had to recover from a dashing first quarter by Glenelg at the Bay.

They won well enough at the finish, but Glenelg suffered a heavy setback when they had to replace Linke and Kendall on the half-back line in the third quarter.

In beating Torrens by 74 points at Prospect, North were most impressive.

Their rucks, with May now running into top form, will put Clarkson and Weir under heavy pressure.

A decisive factor in North's previous win was the dominance of Robran at centre.

He was in great form again today and his clash with Bagshaw at the pivot will be worth going a long

way to see.

The large number of State squad players will give the game added significance in view of the clash against Victoria a week later.

As a result of their losses today Glenelg and Torrens both slipped a rung on the ladder.

The Bays lost fourth place to Norwood and Torrens' third straight defeat dropped them to seventh position.

Norwood's move into the top four was only achieved in the dying stages of the game against Centrals.

Only a half-time reshuffle and a lion-hearted last quarter by Bob Oatey salvaged the two premierships points.

Up to half-time Centrals looked the winners, and on this showing a solitary win is far from a true measure of their ability.

West Adelaide stayed in the picture with a comfortable win over South, who again played only one

winning quarter.

Port overwhelmed Woodville to record the Jay's biggest win, but the Magpies and South Australia suffered a severe setback when John Cahill retired at half-time with a severe elbow injury.

Cahill will be out for a month, and during this period Port meet Glenelg at the Bay and North at Prospect.

The Magpies could be pulled back into the struggle for survival between Norwood, Glenelg, and West.

Norwood and Glenelg meet each other twice during the second round, and these games could be decisive to their chances.

Following the interstate games, the three challengers Norwood, Glenelg, and West are drawn against Sturt, Port, and North.

A win to either one would give their hopes of making the four a big lift.

# Bays' great first term futile against Sturt

When their half-forwards at last tired, Sturt's overall performance improved tremendously.

The Bays' opening was really champagne football. Quick tackling, determination, and good attacking method upset Sturt.

Button, at half-forward was marking and breaking away with ease as the Bays peppered the goal.

Sturt hardly had a player going well in this term.

Even in the second term when they kicked 8-4 to 2-2, it was an uphill battle.

The Bays fought well in this term and the real break came when Haydn Linke went down with a bad knee injury and Martin collared two goals.

Shearman lifted his goals in this term to drive Sturt in many times.

The third term was fairly even, but the Bays let themselves down with bad kicking.

It was in this quarter that Sturt showed signs of clicking.

Tilbrook began to hold some strong marks and Greenslade proved too strong overhead for Phillips.

## No answer

Glenelg finally lost Linke and then Kendall—one after the other—and again Martin cleverly broke away, capitalising on a slow exchange of injured players.

The last term was a foregone conclusion as Sturt's machine began to function.

The Bays now had no answer to the brilliance of Sturt.

Bagshaw and Hicks had the half-forward line moving with confidence.

Glenelg had some moments in this term as Button broke away at half-forward.

But they could not get past Adcock and Schwarz on the last line of defence.

Early in the game Sturt did not have many players playing well, but Adcock and Schwarz were forced by the Glenelg onslaught to play four consistent quarters.

They outmarked and outmanoeuvred their opponents all day to break up many Glenelg attacks.

Shearman's second term was good.

He was mainly the cause of Sturt's fightback.

Greenslade's effort at the goalfrost won him great praise.

My feeling is that he will develop into Sturt's best forward, mainly because of his height and great marking ability.

Another feature of his play is his quick recovery.

He shows great determination and quick thinking.

Sturt's forwards did not come into the game until the second half, but Tilbrook and Martin were brilliant during this period.
