**Defeating Glenelg convincingly at Adelaide today, South showed they will still make a strong bid for a final four berth.**

**South had lost their first four matches.**

The Panthers' command in ruck today exploited a Glenelg weakness and the Bays' determination could not make up for South's edge in skill.

Torreans, in beating Port by 14 points at Thebarton, showed they cannot be left out of final "four" calculations.

Big surprise of the day was Sturt's close call against West at Unley.

The Blues were struggling throughout against West's determined tackling and their refusal to be overawed.

At Prospect, Norwood looked anything but finalists in going down by 40 points to North.

South probably need to win a minimum of 10 of the remaining 14 minor round games to finish in the four.

Every game is important to them from now on.

Their clash with Torreans, who are in fourth place, should be a thriller at Thebarton next week.

Although Cahill's absence was a big blow to Port's chances today, Torreans' more aggressive approach showed they are ready to make their presence felt.

The probable return of Fred Bills next week will give their ruck a lift against the power of Darley and Roberts, who must be controlled if Torreans are to win.

Successive defeats at the hands of two or last season's finalists have taken some of the shine off Glenelg's prospects.

The Bays face West at Adelaide next week and they need a win to restore confidence.

with strong losing performances against Sturt and Port, will be all out to show that two wins out of six is not a true measure of their worth.

Norwood and Port Adelaide turn on a traditional battle at Norwood.

The Redlegs badly need Molloy at centre half-forward and Port just as badly need Cahill.

Peter Darley's field play was magnificent.

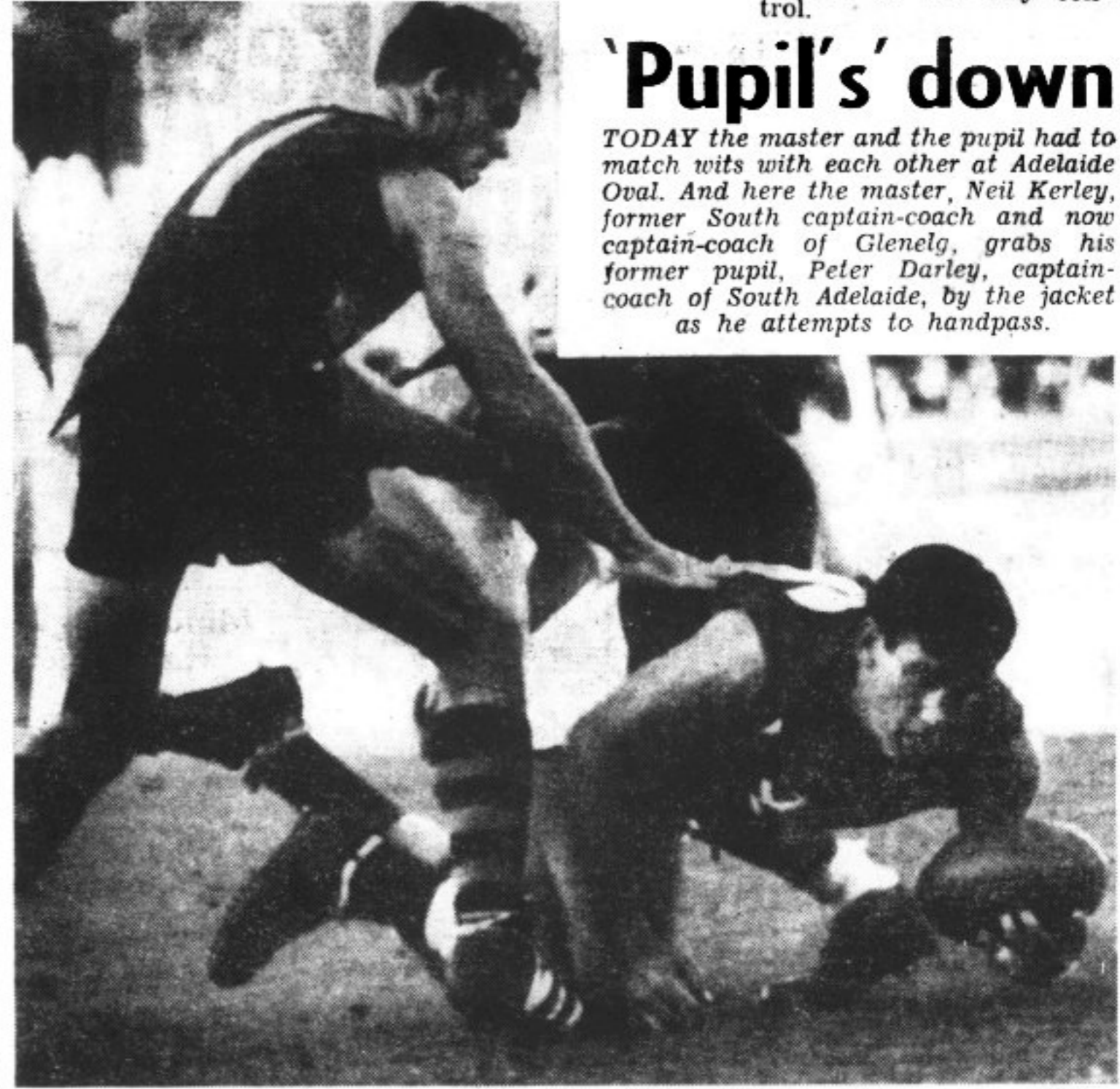
Rivers, Backman, and Skuse were very prominent in an even side.
