

HAMMOND INSPIRES NORTH REVERSAL

With a complete reversal of form inspired by a magnificent last quarter from Bob Hammond at centre half-forward, North Adelaide beat Glenelg by 20 points at Adelaide Oval yesterday.

Glenelg, playing confidently, had been in front all day and looked to have the game well won when it added four goals in the third term without reply by North.

Glenelg led by 25 points at the last change.

Then came Hammond.

His performance was incredible.

Beaten for most of the day by Wayne Phillis, he unleashed a tremendous match-winning last term to kick three goals and provide the springboard for North's win.

Hammond booted North's sixth goal late in the third quarter and opened the last term with a tremendous knock that was picked up by Kym Lehmann and slammed through for a goal within 30 seconds of the start of the term.

Five minutes later John Phillips posted North's eighth goal and after Bob

Geisler pointed a few minutes later North trailed by only 12 points.

Hammond's inspiring play lifted North players all over the ground and they attacked the ball fiercely for the first time.

Hammond was in almost every North move and when he snapped its ninth goal after 10 minutes of play, North was only six points down.

Equaliser

Don Lindner goaled to even the scores six minutes later and when Terry Von Bertouch dragged in a great diving mark and goaled, North hit the front after 20 minutes.

Hammond capped a great term by making it safe with two more goals, and his third was North's seventh for the quarter.

North had looked as though it might get going several times during the game, but it was upset by Glenelg's aggressive, hard-hitting play.

Kel Stringer (wing), Barrie Robran (centre), Michael Burns (half-back) and Lehmann (roving) were winning a lot of kicks, but North did not have a winner in attack.

Ken Smith, Wayne Phillis and Brian Colbey at half-back for Glenelg rebounded most attacks, Ron Redford (back pocket) and Geoff Shepherd (full back) were also on top and Glenelg was pushed forward continually by tigerish rover Colin Paech.

Darley May Fill Set Position For S.A. Seven Ruckmen In Squad

The inclusion of seven ruckmen in the SA squad of 22 suggests that captain Peter Darley will play at centre half-forward against WA at Adelaide Oval on Saturday.

Darley filled that position against Victoria in his first interstate appearance in 1964 — and won the trophy as SA's best.

Although he lacks speed for the position, his strength and high marking would be decided assets.

Jim Forsyth, Tony Clarkson, Noel Teasdale, Keith Spencer, Fred Phillis and Graham Molloy are the six other ruckmen.

Because of a dearth of full forwards Phillis is likely to begin at the

goalfront despite his inaccuracy early in the season when filling that position for Glenelg.

Forsyth's selection was a surprise but since leaving Essendon where he was a "spare parts" man, he has developed into a valuable big man for West Torrens.

He is a strong mark, a powerful kick, and for his size has ample mobility.

Although Sturt ruckman Tony Clarkson is lightly-framed, he leaps well and uses his body cleverly at the bounces and throw-ins.

These two could lead the rucks with Teasdale and Molloy as the followers.

Rover Jeff Potter has lost a yard in pace but he was a driving force in the second half against Victoria.

Of the two incoming rovers South Adelaide's Alan White is the faster, ward Alf Skuse could put pressure on Peter Marker, but the Glenelg youngster will have profited from his "bleeding" in Melbourne.
