BAYS OUT IN FRONT ON LEAGUE LADDER

Glenelg's big win over Norwood and North's six-point margin over West in a thrilling finish left the Bays the only undefeated side at the completion of today's fourth league round.

Torrens scraped in by two points in the face of a fighting finish by Woodville, while South outclassed Centrals with a phenomenal second quarter burst at Adelaide.

At Prospect North stopped West's unbeaten run in a thrilling finish.

West missed the chance to set up a commanding lead when they kicked only one goal from 13 shots in the first quarter.

North then took control in ruck and across centre and with Phillips winning centre half-forward against Loveday went to a commanding half-time lead.

West reorganised in attack to get back into the game in a determined third quarter recovery but North, on top across half-back throughout, were the steadier in an exciting finish.

Glenelg's win over Norwood was marred by the broken jaw sustained by brilliant half-forward flanker Damian Nygaard when he was felled by Neil Kerley after disposal in the second quarter.

Up to this point the scores were in touch.

Glenelg then took control and with Phillips in great touch at full forward were not seriously challenged.

The Redlegs finished with a creditable 114 points, however, and only need to tighten their defence to stretch the sides above them to the limit.

At Thebarton, Fred Bills showed how valuable his strength and resolution are to Torrens when the Eagles staved off Woodville in a thrilling finish.

Typical game

Bills was Torrens best with a typical display on the ball.

South surprised Centrals by using Backman as a rover from the start of the game at Adelaide.

The Panthers switched Thirds player Palmer to centre half-forward and both moves succeeded.

The result was never in doubt after South's second quarter onslaught.

Match of the day next week will be the West-Glenelg clash at Richmond.

A win to Glenelg would open up a two-game break for the Tigers at the top of the premiership table.

In four games so far

the Bays have maintained a 50 points plus margin over the opposition.

However, West at Richmond, with the chance to cut back Glenelg's one-game advantage will make this a real thriller.

With North, Sturt and Port opposed to Woodville, Centrals and Norwood, there could be a widening of the gap between the middle order teams and those at present trailing the field.

Glenelg gained most of their drive from across centre, where Crabb and Rosewarne won all day on the wings.

Ken Eustice gained momentum as the game progressed and his ability to get his kick quickly paid dividends in a tight game.

The Bay rovers, Pattinson and Voigt, were far better than the Norwood pair, even though their rucks were beaten.

Hamilton, looking a little overweight, produced a good last half to take a big hand in the scoring.

He looks to be improving with every match.

The Bays' backlines today lacked the sting it had produced in earlier games and only Colbey early and Rowe at full back showed form.

In ruck, Norwood had the trumps, with Woolford winning early and Kuchel finishing the game well.

ONLY ONE MAGPIE IN SA SQUAD

For the first time in history, Port Adelaide have only one player in the State football squad.

The State selectors, Messrs. C. L. Pyatt, R. A. Lee, and A. D. Hickinbotham, tonight named the following players in the SA football squad for the Australian championships, commencing in Adelaide on June 7:

Teasdale (Woodville), R. Schoff (Sturt).

Club representation is Sturt (7), West, North, and Glenelg each 4, South 3, Norwood, Torrens and Woodville each 2, Port Adelaide, and Centrals each 1.

Players not considered because of injury were Cahill and Obst (Port Adelaide), Nygaard (Norwood), Stringer (North), Tilbrook (Sturt), and Simunser (Woodville).

The injuries to Cahill and Obst have restricted Port's representation to an all time low of one player, Elleway, and he could be challenged for his place by Centrals full back Trevor Stanton who is currently in brilliant form.

With a dearth of regular wingmen in form, the omission of South's Mark Coombe is surprising.

Coombe started his career last year on the wing and has been a South strongpoint at centre since switching to the pivot.

He looks an ideal wingman type however, with a ton of speed and a penetrating kick.
