
NORWOOD TAKE GRIP ON



Norwood today took a decisive step on the way to the major round when they beat Gleneig convincingly by 41 points at the Bay today.

As a result the Redlegs moved into the top four for the first time since the opening round when they surprised Port at Norwood.

Chance


Moyes came from nearly all positions in the goalwards stampede, and Glenelg defence looked ragged as htey tried to contain them.
