## 'FOUR' BERTH SPURS BAYS

With a place in the final four as incentive, Glenelg rose to the occasion in great style at Unley to defeat Sturt by five points in a thrilling finish.

As was the case at Alberton last week, Sturt were jumped in the first quarter. Glenelg, with the breeze, led at one stage 5-2 to 1-1.

Glenelg shot away again in the third term with a burst of 6-2 to one point.

At this stage the Tigers led by seven goals and Sturt looked a beaten side.

But the Blues recovered late in the third quarter, and with Tilbrook getting clear of Colbey, just failed to run the Bays down.

Glenelg's early ascendancy was the result of a more determined approach.

Sturt may have been feeling the effects of last week's heavy clash at Alberton, but Glenelg's attitude was far more positive.

The Blues played from behind and paid the penalty.

Glenelg's moves in the forward lines unsettled Sturt's defence.

Osborn, the most damaging player in Glenelg's forward lines, played vir-

tually as a forward pocket with the ruckman taking Chessell or Bagshaw out to half-back.

Sturt were kept in the game early by their rovers and followers.

### Advantage

Shearman became more effective at the pivot in the second term after a quiet opening, but Glenelg's switch of Marker to centre after half time swung the advantage back to Glenelg.

Sturt countered by putting Schoff into the middle, Friedrichs to centre half - forward. Shearman into the back pocket, with Bagshaw and Chessell changing on the half forward flank.

Schoff retired at three quarter time and Shearman resumed at the pivot. He played a strong last quarter.

Sensing danger when Sturt took the initiative in the last quarter, Glenelg switched Fred Phillis and Sandland.

The move proved significant as Sandland kicked two of the Bays' three goals in the last quarter.

Although Bagshaw and Chessell played effectively for Sturt, the Glenelg followers Button and Wayne Phillis were a force for their side, particularly up to the point of Glenelg's big third quarter lead.

Kernahan was effective in stopping any Sturt ruck ascendancy.

Umpire Caulfield, in his anxiety to keep the game moving, allowed far too many breaches to go unpenalised.

### ... And Port are on top

Glenelg's unexpected win over Sturt in a thrilling finish at Unley dislodged the Blues from top place and put the Tigers in the box seat for a place in the final four.

The Bays dramatic victory put the onus on Norwood to beat Port at Alberton next week to retain fourth ranking.

Glenelg meet Torrens at the Bay and on the score of incentive alone should win.

The Redlegs have not beaten Port at Alberton since 1966 but with a major round berth at stake should produce top form against their old rivals.

Port did not win as well as generally predicted against North today, although they never appeared to be in danger.

Their experienced players steadied the side under pressure.

Norwood led all the way against South, whose phenomenal accuracy kept them in the game.

### BIG MARGIN

At Thebarton, Torrens finally killed West's hopes

with a 71-point margin—the biggest win of the day.

In inflicting the season's second defeat on premiers favorites, Sturt, Glenelg jumped the Blues in the first term and raced away in similar style in the third.

The failure of the Sturt wings to generate any drive highlights the loss Sturt have suffered as a result of Hick's injury.

Glenelg's determination was a big feature—they forced Sturt into many errors with quick tackling and frequent smothering of the ball.

On today's performance, the Tigers deserve to make the four.

Consolation for Sturt was the return to form of Peter Endersbee.
