

# ROOSTERS' SHOCK LOSS

League leaders Sturt and Port Adelaide continued on their winning way in league football today, but North Adelaide fell from favor when they were clearly beaten by Woodville.

After disappointing displays in their two previous games, Woodville turned on a fine exhibition of teamwork to record their first win over North since entering the competition in 1964.

North were without champion Barrie Robran who withdrew from the side because of a thigh injury sustained in the interstate game.

Even so, Woodville were far more impressive and their three-goal margin would have been wider if they hadn't been content to defend in the latter part of the last quarter.

Woodville's win revives their pre-season hopes of making the final four.

Their power is concentrated in and around the ruck.

### Back to form

stronger last quarter cut Norwood's winning margin to 37 points.

The Redlegs' switch of Carman to centre half-forward looked a promising move, although Bob Loveday made an impressive return to West's defence.

Bob Oatey played his best game for the season and finished with five goals.

Port went into second place, a game clear of North, when they eased away from South after an even first half at Adelaide.

South rearranged their defence before the game, putting Palmer to full back and Cock to centre half-back on Woite.

Freeman kicked six and the Magpies won by 39 points.

Sturt swamped Central District at Elizabeth to retain their unbeaten record.

At this stage Port appear to be the only side with the ability to lower the Blues' colors.
