# WHOLE 18 AT FAULT: KERLEY

## Stunning upset

"The whole side let Glenelg down," coach Neil Kerley said tonight, still trying to work out how the Tigers were beaten by South at Glenelg Oval today.

The eight-point upset defeat of the 1970 runners-up could prove the biggest upset of the season.

South coach, Jim Deane, recalled how he had read out an embarrassing lack of kicks and marks to all his players during the half-time interval.

At half-time Glenelg led South by 48 points (14-11 to 7-5).

At the finish, with South fans almost hysterical, it was South 21-15 (141 points) to Glenelg's 19-19 (133).

Kerley said: "No one player could be blamed. The whole side let Glenelg down."

"I don't know how we were beaten. I only wish I knew."

Deane said: "When the players came into the South room at half-time their spirits were pretty low."

"So I took as my theme the statistics relating to the marks and kicks taken by each South player during the first half."

"I read them out individually.

"It was pretty embarrassing to them all."

"Our players were confident at three-quarter time when we trailed by one point."

"I told them they could win from there."

"They did just that and did it well."

Deane said the win would do a lot for the club.

Tonight, South celebrated at their annual club ball in the Latvian Hall, Wayville.

At Adelaide Oval West defeated Centrals by one point—another surprise.

It had happened before in recent years.

A philosophical Centrals coach, Dennis Jones, said tonight: "It must be just my luck."

In the four years I have coached Centrals we have lost to West four times by one straight kick.

"Three times the margin has been one point against Centrals."

Jones said West won

the game in the first 10 minutes of the third quarter.

In that period, West kicked 5-2 and went on to get 8-5 for the quarter (to Centrals' 4-3).

Torrans gave the highly fancied Norwood a fright at Norwood.

Torrans led by 10 points seven minutes into the last quarter.

But the Redlegs came home strongly to win by 18 points.

Norwood full forward Mike Coligan with seven goals today goes to the top of the goalkicking list.

He has kicked 15 goals in two matches.

Glenelg and State full forward Fred Phillis' four goals against South gives him 12.

North kicked the highest score of the day with 27-25 to Woodville's 8-12.

Sturt had kicked 25-24 against Woodville last week.
