The capacity crowd of 20,280 was officially only 720 short of the record 21,000 attendance at the Sturt-Norwood game at Norwood Oval in 1955.

## Robran lands in hospital

 North's champion dual Magarey Medalist Barrie Robran is in hospital tonight with a suspected broken blood vessel in the right eye.

But that record Norwood crowd was only an estimate.

It is doubtful if any more people could have fitted into Norwood today.

Today's total attendance of 48,901 was easily the largest to watch a five-match Saturday series this season.

And, following today's eighth round, the total attendance for the season is nearly 15,000 up on the comparative total at this stage last year.

Norwood produced a more convincing performance than they did against Sturt last week, but still succumbed to Port's power by 38 points.

The Redlegs still are likely semi-finalists, but their premiership hopes have been dented by successive losses to Sturt and Port.

Norwood have dropped one win (two points) behind Sturt, Port, and North as a result of today's loss.

Glenelg leapt from second bottom (ninth) to sixth by beating West by 46 points in a mediocre game at Glenelg Oval.

Surprise of today's games was Torrens' 15-point win over Woodville at Thebarton.

He is expected to be detained in hospital for a few days.

And Robran is very doubtful to play against Sturt at Adelaide Oval in next Saturday's match of the day.

He went off in the last quarter of today's game against South at Adelaide Oval.

Robran's wife, Taimi, was the only visitor allowed him in hospital tonight.

West full back, Hallett Shueard, is likely to miss at least two games after dislocating his left knee

in the game against Glenelg at the Bay Oval. Shueard's knee was put back into position, but was still very painful after the game.

Norwood vice-captain, and half back flanker, Ross Porritt, suffered a bruised hand and a corked thigh against Port.

Norwood's centre half-forward, John Wynne, received a heavy knock on a hip, but the full extent of his injury will not be known until tomorrow (Sunday), or even later.

South wingman Mark Coombe suffered a recurrence of a groin injury.

## AT GLENELG

After an even first half, Glenelg streaked away from West in the third term and were not strongly challenged in winning by 46 points.

Stronger rucks, a superior centre line, and Fred Phillis at the goalfront were the main factors in the Bays' convincing win.

In perfect conditions, the game was full of errors.

Glenelg began in fine style. With W. Phillis and then Hockridge in command in ruck, they took the ball away from the centre bounces with great assurance to race to a four-goal lead.

But the pressure was not sustained.

West switched Burkett and Fraser in the first 10 minutes, got a lift in ruck from McDonald, and were back in the game at the first change.

### Penetrating

Into the second quarter, the game continued without distinction except for Voigt's penetrating roving and the ascendancy of Rawson and Osborn on Glenelg's centre wings.

Marker, who in Sandland's absence had started at centre half-forward, went on the ball and Crabb took centre half-forward for the rest of the game.

Both were effective in Glenelg's stronger second half.

Verrier's marking was a West strongpoint, but in general the Bays held control in ruck.

West had chances to take the lead in the

second term, with Hewitt showing the way through centre half-forward, but once again their kicking for goal was astray.

Just before half-time, West switched wings in an effort to shake Glenelg's ascendancy in these positions.

But Rawson in particular continued to drive Glenelg forward in the third term when they made the game safe.

The Bays looked good as they flashed the ball into attack from the centre bounces with rucks and rovers combining to move the ball quickly to the goalfront. Five goals from D. Phillis were the result, and West were forced into changes to keep in the game.

### Unlucky

Plew replaced Noonan and went to the half-back flank he was unlucky to lose.

Hooper, one of West's better players in the first half, took the wing and Leonard, an unlikely looking half-back, went to half-forward.

Almost immediately West lost Shueard and

finally settled for Thompson to guard Phillis, Loveday to centre half-back, and Sara to the flank.

Meanwhile Phillis kicked his eighth goal and West were relying on a miracle.

Two quick goals by West in the last quarter alarmed Kerley to the extent of replacing McNamara with Pattinson.

However West did not have the resources to produce an Adelaide Cup Day finish.

Rosewarne's competent second half at centre completed Glenelg's dominance of this line, and the Bays had 10 scoring shots without reply from West after the first seven minutes.
