TIGERS 'NEEDED

MELBOURNE, Today: Richmond full-forward Royce Hart kicked an amazing 15 goals from 17 scoring shots in the Tigers' practice match against Glenelg at Richmond today.

Glenelg spearhead Fred Phillis kicked six goals, being one of the Bays' best players.

The SA Tigers, when they adjusted to the pace of the game, put up a fair display, but at the final siren Richmond had won by 69 points.

However, Glenelg played well enough to point out some glaring weaknesses among their VFL opponents.

Laurie Rosewarne held dual Brownlow Medallist and ex-St. Kilda centreman Ian Stewart to two kicks in the first half.

But Stewart won his share for the rest of the game.

At half-time Richmond led 17-6 to 9-8, and they were winning in most positions.

Royce Hart's marking, kicking, and wonderful position play thrilled the crowd and certainly Richmond officials. Hart had eight goals to half-time.

Richmond's new big man, former South Adelaide and East Fremantle ruckman Brian Roberts, often came under notice.

Big knocks

The 6 ft. 7 in. giant marked and kicked well.

Some of his centre knock-outs almost reached the half-forward line.

However, in today's warm conditions, he appeared slow. This was offset by fast, accurate handball.

Richmond's other "big recruit," Ian Stewart, from St. Kilda, was extremely quiet in the centre, but a couple of times when he did control the ball he found a teammate.

Fred Phillis Glenelg's full forward who was signed by Richmond two seasons ago, was far too good for full back Barry Richardson.

Phillis led and marked well and had four goals to half-time. If his kicking had been better he could have had eight. Glenelg should be heartened by the form of Phillis.

Phillis kicked more than 100 goals last season, and several Victorian scouts were at the ground today to see him in action.

HART'

Glenelg sadly missed the drive of brilliant Peter Marker, from the centre.

Marker, highly regarded in VFL circles, withdrew from the Bay team on Thursday.

The Bays also felt the loss of State half-back Brian Colbey who also had to withdraw. Colbey had a strained thigh muscle.

In a very even Richmond side, Roger Dean and Francis Bourke were always under notice, while big ruckman Ray Bovanich showed some improvement.

John Sandland was Glenelg's best player, beating two opponents.
