Glenelg, after leading for most of the game, were overwhelmed by North's great last quarter burst to finally go down by 39 points.

Glenelg faded out of the game when the back lines were disorganised with Robran's switch, plus Tregenza's injury.

Tregenza's influence in the first half started most of Glenelg's forward moves, but after a bad knock he rested in the forward pocket for the whole of the third term and Glenelg's drive suffered.

Robran and Cornes had the crowd on their feet. Most were annoyed at the attention Robran was getting while at centre half-forward.

Even then he was the architect of North's attacking moves, but Cornes had done well in preventing him from being more prominent.

The first half was all Glenelg and even in the opening of the third term the Bays were prominent. Yet even with most of the play the Bay could not show their superiority and break away.

### POOR KICKING AT GOALS

North did not help their cause with their poor kicking at goals but Glenelg never made full use of this.

North exploded midway through the third term when Robran found freedom in ruck and many players lifted their game.

Neil Sachse became a force at centre half forward and Robinson, a clear winner at centre wing gave the necessary drive.

The third term produced the best passages of play for the game even though Glenelg began to fold.

North's only two really consistent players were Robran and Michael Burns at half-back.

Robran was their best. He brought many players into the game when shifted on to the ball.

Robinson won his wing well and Von Bertouch was their best rover without reaching great heights.

Jeff Strang produced a solid game at half-back. He played most of his games in Melbourne in this position so he looks as though he will remain there.

Glenelg had their best players only in the first half. Peter Carey at centre half-forward gave the Bays an avenue of attack and although Hamilton did not have many touches he handballed efficiently in Glenelg's early scoring spree.

Tregenza won ruck handily and his fierce approach brushed many aside. It was a pity an injury took him out of prominence.
