3 GET JOLT

A brawl involving 34 players (but no reports) . . . one player reported at another game . . . three shock results.

. . . they were the highlights of today's thirteenth round of league football—the most incident-packed series of this topsy-turvy season.

The Woodville-Centrals game at Woodville Oval erupted early in the second quarter when, in an amazing scene, 34 players

tangled in one of the worst brawls seen in South Australian football for years.

Fists and boots flew as the umpires tried to sep-

arate the tangled mass of players. But there were no reports.

Port ruckman Keith

Spencer was reported at

Alberton Oval.

Spencer was reported by field umpire John Caulfield for allegedly elbowing North centre half-back Bohdan Jaworskyj in the face in the third quarter.

Spencer was playing his 150th league game.

During the game, Jaworskyj had a front tooth knocked out and another front tooth loosened.

He also had a chunk gouged out of his bottom lip.

Tipsters again shook their heads in dismay as three of the five games provided upsets.

Biggest shock came at Woodville, where the home team (seventh) beat top side Centrals by five points.

Torrens (second bottom, but now eighth) outplayed second-ranked Norwood by 16 points at Norwood.

And South probably ruined Glenelg's finals' hopes when they finished 12 points ahead of the Tigers at Adelaide Oval.

Only changes to the top four were North's move from third to second position and Norwood's slip from second to third.

Glenelg's chances of getting into the final four are slim indeed.

INJURIES

Glenelg ruckman Wayne Phillis pulled a hamstring muscle at Adelaide Oval, and went off in the second quarter.

Torrens' wingman Craig Work pulled a hamstring muscle at Norwood, and was replaced in the second term.

Woodville rover Johnny O'Connor injured his right shoulder, and went off in the last quarter at Woodville.

South half-back Phil Reimann injured a knee at Adelaide.

Centrals' wingman Richard Cochrane suffered slight concussion, and went off in the second quarter at Woodville.

North back pocket Geoff Paul pinched a nerve in his neck, and retired in the last quarter at Alberton.

South match Bay challenge

After establishing a clear superiority in the first half, South withstood a determined recovery by Glenelg to record a well deserved win at Adelaide Oval.

The Bays levelled the scores with a string of behinds in the last quarter and had the chances to win but were let down by poor forward work.

By contrast the Panthers had a match winner in Howlett who kicked 6-2 while Fred Phillis could manage only 0-5 for the Bays.

Darley's dominance in ruck and Bennett's creative game at centre half-forward got South away to a flying start.

The Panthers were faster to the ball and used handball with great skill.

The Glenelg defence

was very loose and South should have led by more than their 9 point margin at the first change.

South's move in playing Jones as a permanent forward pocket paid dividends, particularly in the first half.

Jones was virtually at full-forward and Howlett, covering a lot of ground, kicked four goals before half-time.

To add to their troubles in ruck, Glenelg lost Wayne Phillis in the second term.

Up to this point, Colbey in defence and Cornes on the ball had been the Bays' main

strengths in a very sluggish display.

At the start of the third term, the Bays looked a far more determined side.

Carey began to match Darley in ruck, Martin got on top at centre, while Osborn and Cornes in attack gave the forward lines a lift.

The defence of Haines at centre half-back was significant in South retaining the lead at three quarter time.

But the Bays looked capable of going on to a win.
