# JAMES, 'GREENIE' GET

Ten-goal performances by Sturt's experienced sharpshooter, Malcolm Greenslade, and Port's talented young full forward, Max James, highlighted today's fourteenth round of league football.

Greenslade's classy display helped carry Sturt to a crushing 96-point win over South—a victory which proves the Blues still can offer a bold challenge for this year's premiership.

James' 10 goals were instrumental in Port demoralising West by 79 points at Alberton—a result which lifted Port above Norwood into third position and confirmed just how low West have sunk since their fine start to the season.

Top team Centrals stayed two points clear of North by snatching a thrilling one-point win over Norwood at Elizabeth.

The game was interrupted late in the last quarter when a spectator jumped the fence in the outer and ran on to the ground to remonstrate with

field umpire Max O'Connell.

The man was grabbed by a boundary umpire and O'Connell spoke to him before he was escorted from the field by two policemen.

Unley and Prospect Ovals should be bursting at the seams next Saturday when Sturt play Port and North meet Centrals in what are likely to be two of the best games of the season.

The Sturt-Port clash could well determine which of the two sides gets into the final four, assuming that Centrals,

North, and Norwood are "set."

Sturt's finals chances are enhanced through their healthy percentage—second only to North.

Today's total attendance of 40,729 took the season's total to 685,483—nearly 100,000 up on last year.

Centrals' centre half-forward, John Wyley, broke a blood vessel in a calf and was replaced in the second quarter at Elizabeth.

Torrens' left-footed half-forward flanker, Steve Pavlich, was a reserve against Glenelg at Thebarton after pulling out of the starting 18 because of severe headaches.

Pavlich's headaches were caused by intense study for examinations.

At Prospect, Woodville half-back Rob Reid injured a knee and went off at quarter-time. But the trouble is not serious.

An immaculate burst of nine goals by Glenelg in the third term shot them away from Torrens and paved the way for a comfortable 41-point victory.

Sandland was the main scorer for the Bays in this burst by bagging four in the third term, two in the last to make it seven for the game.

The game was rescued from being a bore by a better performance from both sides in the second half.

After a combined scoring effort of 2.12 in the second term, straight kicking came into the game when 14.4 was produced in the third term and 11.2 in the last.

Glenelg's effort was worth 15.2 in the latter half to the Eagles' 11.4.

Glenelg were set going all day from the centre bounces by the ruck dominance of Bob Tardif who picked up 20 effective taps and never wasted one of them.

Tregenza, Cornes, and Caldwell were good allies in this section while Voigt returned to his best roving form.

Torrens started with Pavlich on the fence and Fielke taking the half-forward flank. Pavlich had

Torrens dominated the play in the first 10 minutes and had they been on target they could have set up a handy lead, but they managed only 1-4.

Fred Bills, Watson, Fielke, and Dabrowski were prominent in this early Eagle burst while Brenton Bills and Kelly held any Bay attack well in attack.

Late in the term the

overhead marking of Tardif, Sandland, and Carey carved a passage to the Bays goal front.

The defences of both sides dominated in the second term when the scoring was kept to a minimum and was helped by a bout of shocking goal shooting by both sides.

The game had sunk to a dull battle and mistakes far outweighed the good points in the third term.

Sandland to full forward with Carey out to centre half-forward was a profitable half-time move for Glenelg. Sandland was a threat with his freakish marking and straight kicking.

But it was Tardif who got the credit for starting it all with his faultless taps at the bounces from where Voigt, MacFarlane, and Millard swept the ball forward quickly.

### Trouble

Torrens were not idle while the Bays were scoring and they gave plenty of trouble with players like the Bills brothers, Shallow, Faletic, Dabrowski, and Watson to run on 5-2 themselves.

Cornes and Caldwell relished the task of changing ruck on the half-forward flank and chipped in for three of the Bays' 9-2 for the term to put them 37 points clear at the last change.

The straight kicking of Glenelg continued in the last session when they added six goals to Torrens 5-2 and there lies the story of their victory.
