2 big footy upsets

A day of shocks and records . . . that was today's secondlast minor round series of league football.

Not only did North and Sturt lose, but their losing margins made the results at Prospect and Elizabeth two of the season's biggest upsets.

Port and Centrals issued warnings that they must NOT be taken lightly in this year's finals.

Port's mammoth score—25-.0—was the highest kicked by a visiting team at Prospect. Previous best was Port's 22-15 in 1937.

And Port's 77-point victory was the biggest win by a visiting team at Prospect. Previous best was Port's 58-point win in 1938.

Today's record crowd at Elizabeth — 15,271 — was 454 more than previous best attendance of 14,817 at the Port-Centrals match at Elizabeth on August 5.

Today's total attendance of 50,004 was only the second time this season that the aggregate crowd for a five-game Saturday has exceeded 50,000. Best this year is 51,616 in the sixth round.

Bob Oatey allowed Norwood to convincingly outpoint a determined Glenelg at Norwood Oval.

At one stage the Redlegs had notched 16 goals from 22 shots and Glenelg could manage only 11 from 25 shots.

The Bays could well say that bad kicking for goal lost them the match, but their forwards could not be blamed even though they did miss a few easy chances.

Glenelg rarely looked for a player ahead of centre, preferring to blaze away as the Norwood defence exerted a good degree of pressure.

Norwood on the other hand, with Bob Oatey setting the pattern, were able to deliver the ball positively, giving team mates a deliberate shot at goal.

FOOT PASSES SET THE PATTERN

Some of Oatey's foot passes across field to a player leading directly downfield were unbelievable and emphasised just how much the Redlegs are playing by reflex.

The Redlegs surprisingly opened with Carman at centre half-forward and Wynne at centre, and they paid the penalty.

Marker controlled the game for Glenelg in the first five minutes of play and the Bays should have capitalised more than the 2-1 that resulted.

But the advent of Carman to the pivot and the increasing influence of Oatey, aided by strong ruckwork, allowed Norwood to grab the initiative.

They produced a burst of four goals in seven minutes from the 16-minute mark of the first term and thereafter had an answer for everything produced by Glenelg.

The Bays drew to within seven points of the Redlegs eleven minutes into the third term and twice reduced the leeway to 13 points, but Norwood always had an answer.

Each time Glenelg threatened, Norwood were able to work the ball through winning flankers in Pettingill and Woodcock to a reliable spearhead in Coligan.

At the other end of the ground, Glenelg found difficulty in finding a safe avenue of attack as the Norwood defence stood firm.

Norwood's Butchart and Poulter eclipsed Sandland and Fred Phillis respectively, leaving only the big marking ability of Wayne Phillis their only striking power.

The switch of Sandland to full forward, Fred Phillis to a flank, and Moss to centre half-forward, although left too long, almost paid a dividend.

Moss injected a good deal of life into the forward area with his tear-away tactics and Sandland should have bagged at least three goals.


Although he outmarked Poulter, he failed to find the big white uprights and Glenelg suffered accordingly without having an influence on the outcome.

Shown the way by the constructive Robert Oatey
—he even took a personal hand in the kick-offs on
two occasions—the Redlegs always had the ability
to score when needed.

Four players in their forward area bagged 17 goals of their tally, showing how well the Redlegs capitalised on their goal scoring potential ahead of centre.
