ROUND FIVE KOs MANY

A fracture, a dislocation, concussion, and severely torn muscles . . .

. . . these were the worst of an injury-ridden fifth round of league football yesterday.

Apart from the unusually bad injury list, the series was marred by a wild last quarter in the Centrals-South game at Elizabeth.

Norwood ruckman Michael Gregg fractured his left cheekbone early in the third quarter at Glenelg Oval.

Earlier, Glenelg's boom recruit from Richmond, Steve Hywood, was replaced early in the second

quarter with a pulled left hamstring muscle.

Glenelg's classy young half-forward Greg Wickens, who kicked six goals went off in the last term with slight concussion.

Behind play

At Adelaide Oval, Woodville ruckman Ray Boyanich dislocated his right shoulder in the third quarter.

Boyanich had the shoulder reset at Queen Elizabeth Hospital and was allowed to leave. He may miss only one match.

South juniors George Czaja and David Young were admitted to Burnside War Memorial Hospital with concussion after a torrid last term at Elizabeth.

Czaja, felled behind the play, was still unconscious after the game, but recov-

ered in hospital.

South finished the game with only 16 men after Czaja and Young were carried off.

Earlier, centreman Phil Reimann (thigh) and ruckman Jeff Ryan (bruised chest) were replaced in the third quarter.

Centrals half-forward Dean Mobbs injured an ankle in the third term, and rover Chris McLay was carried off after being met heavily by South rover Gary Bracegirdle in the last quarter.

The incident triggered the fiery last term.

McLay had eight stitches inserted in a badly gashed forehead.

Port ruckman Paul Marrett tore a muscle behind his left knee at Unley. He was not replaced.

Tigers' early burst enough

A four-goal burst in five minutes by Glenelg early in the first quarter put Norwood on the defensive and the Redlegs struggled for the rest of the day.

After a heavily defensive first quarter, the Redlegs were not without a chance when their turn came to use the breeze.

But the Bays received full value from their scoring shots into the wind and outscored Norwood 5-1 to 3-4 to have the game well in their keeping at half-time.

The Redlegs again looked a possibility at the start of the third quarter when they kicked two goals without reply. This was their last effort.

From this point, Glenelg added 10-13 to the Redlegs' 3-2 and for the fifth game straight, topped the 20-goal mark.

Glenelg got their early impetus from Tardif and Cornes in ruck.

Tardif died somewhat in the second half, but Cornes maintained his game throughout, his dash and

teamwork being largely responsible for the greater fluency of the Bays' game.

However, neither side displayed much sustained teamwork in the first half, perhaps because the wind made the ball hard to judge in the air and kicking difficult to control.

But on the day, the Bays' ability to keep the ball moving effectively was far superior.

Switched

In the second term, Norwood did for a time take the initiative, mainly through Gregg in ruck, but the Bays showed the ability to answer each Norwood goal.

Hamilton's unobtrusive game at centre was a con-

stant source of drive and Wickens' skill at half-forward right eventually forced the switch of Dillon in the third quarter.

Alive to the danger of Carman at full forward, the Bays had two flying against him and Carman was switched to centre half-forward in the second half.

Norwood's defensive move of Rosser into the backlines in the first quarter paid dividends.

No goals

Glenelg's scoring rate was slowed and Seekamp, who went to the wing, provided the Redlegs with some drive from this position.

Norwood were unfortunate to lose Gregg early in the third quarter.

Button's game lifted in the second half, but the Redlegs had too few winning positions to look like overhauling the Bays.

The Bays' big score was kicked without a significant contribution from either of their key forward players.

Fred Phillis was goalless and Peter Carey only occasionally effective.

Norwood looked a badly disorganised side in the last quarter when Glenelg attacked almost at will and the game finished on a lame note.

Sunday Mail-Balfours 'PLAYER OF YEAR' \$500 AWARD

Two captains, Peter Marker of Glenelg and John Cahill of Port Adelaide, have grabbed a one-point lead in the Sunday Mail-Balfours \$500 "Player of the Year" award.

Marker, who was one of four leaders last, scored a third preference vote in his team's convincing victory against Norwood, to retain the lead with Cahill who leap-frogged to the lead with a best afield vote.

West Torrens' interstate recruit, Ian Wallace, entered the voting with a vengeance. Playing at the pivot, he was judged best-on-ground in his team's loss to Woodville.

The man he was standing, Eddie Holland, won the second preference vote.

Three players who

have represented SA also entered the voting for the first time with best-on-ground votes.

All members of winning teams, Glenelg's Graham Cornes, North Adelaide's Terry Von Bertouch and Central Districts' Robin Mulholland seem to have found their form at the right time.
