I started off with appendicitis and nearly finished with a heart attack," said Centrals' captain-coach Tony Casserly.

The Bulldog boss did not play in yesterday's one-point win over Glenelg at Elizabeth because of an appendicitis attack.

"I'll tell you that one-point win was the best medicine possible—I recommend it for anyone with appendicitis."

Casserly was at the ground yesterday spurring his side to victory after being in hospital for two days with the attack.

"The attack has died down," Casserly said from his Elizabeth home. "I hope to be back selling houses on Monday and playing next Saturday."

**HIGHEST**

Centrals' 17-16 was the highest score they have kicked against Glenelg at Elizabeth; Glenelg's 18-9 was the highest losing score the Bays have ever kicked against Centrals.

In another siren incident, this time at Elizabeth, supporters started streaming on to the ground before the final siren.

Umpire Peter Mead had bounced the ball to start play with Bays going into attack when the scramble started.

Seconds later the siren sounded to end the game with many young supporters crowded around Mead and the other players.

Woodville's dressing rooms looked more like an Army clearing station after the match against West at Woodville.

Chris Hopkins (pulled hamstring) was replaced Fowles at quarter time and will miss at least one game. Mike Doszna, went off in the third term, was replaced by Heaven after injuring ribs and a hip bone. He is also almost certain to be out of action for at least one match.

Yesterday's total attendance of 42,540 was the first time for three weeks the five games had attracted more than 40,000.
