# BAYS AGAIN A BIG FORCE

## Watch out for the Tigers!

This is the message Glenelg growled to the other league clubs in downing Norwood at Football Park yesterday.

Norwood sat in second spot on the premiership ladder, but have now slipped to third — two wins in front of Glenelg.

Glenelg are back in action.

After a slow start to the year they now have their eyes on that "premiers" tag.

Yesterday the Bays were magnificent.

They showed their style of old, playing the ball, running, kicking, and running again.

Next week they play Woodville at the Bay, and despite their good form, cannot afford to take the Peckers lightly.

## STARS OUT

Sturt could be without two of their stars Paul Bagshaw and Greg Wild, for next week's game against West Adelaide at Unley.

The Blues lost Wild within three minutes of the start of the game against Torrens at Thebarton.

Wild went down with a badly torn hamstring muscle at centre half-forward and was helped to the boundary by three trainers.

Goldsworthy replaced him as the trainers carried him to the dressing rooms on a stretcher.

Sturt officials said he was almost certain to miss one game, could probably miss two, and could be out longer.

The Blues were down to 18 men only minutes into the second term when Bagshaw was carried off on a stretcher.

He had sprained both ankles and was replaced by Barton.

Officials said Bagshaw's injuries would be examined today.

It would not be known until he had undergone a thorough examination whether he would miss next week's game.

In the upset of the day, Woodville came out clear winners over Centrals in a hard-fought game at Woodville.

Their 36-point victory came after a day of solid football from both sides.

Woodville have now beaten Centrals 14 times since both sides entered the league competition in 1964.

Today's upset win took them a game ahead of the Bulldogs after both had been even on 13 wins each.

At Adelaide Oval North maintained their hoodoo over South with a tight finish and narrow margin of six points.

North are only two games behind Centrals (fifth) with seven matches to complete the minor round.

The Roosters made it 14 consecutive wins over the Panthers at all venues.

North were ahead at every turn, but had to survive a blistering run-home by South who added 7-2 to 1-4 in the last quarter.
