# JACKMAN REPORTED

## Carman will be witness

Norwood star Phil Carman was again in the thick of things at Adelaide Oval yesterday.

Carman will this week be making his fourth trip to Football House in as many weeks, but this time as a witness in a report case.

South centreman, Ian Jackman, was reported by field umpire Robin Bennet

for allegedly striking Carman in the first five minutes of the South-Norwood clash.

The charge against Jackman alleged that he deliberately struck Carman on the back of the head with a clenched right fist.

The report followed an incident the first time the ball went into Norwood's attacking zone.

Jackman and Carman appeared to clash, and

Carman fell face downwards as the ball was moved towards the South goal.

Umpire Bennet raced in and spoke to Jackman with Carman still on the ground.

Carman was awarded a free kick, and was quickly on to his feet.

He appeared to suffer no ill effects and went on to be Norwood's best player for the game.

Most of the 20 players went AWOL for almost three quarters at Glenelg Oval yesterday.

Some were last seen strutting proudly off the ground at half-time, believing, apparently, that because Woodville led by two points, they were going to repeat their shock six-point win over Glenelg in the seventh round this season.

The Tigers thought their opponents ALL reappeared after half-time.

There is some doubt about it, according to the scoreboard, which showed Glenelg outscored Woodville 11-7 to 2-5 in the second half.

Grave fears are held for the safety of some Woodville players.

It is understood they could not have played in the third quarter when Glenelg kicked 5-4 to Woodville's 0-3.

They may have been the same players who were presumed missing in the first quarter when Glenelg booted 3-9 to Woodville's 0-0.

It is possible a few players may have sunk in the smelly mud and slosh that

passed as Glenelg Oval's surface.

Woodville officials are treating with contempt a suggestion some players either got locked in the dressing room at half-time or frustratedly took "a dive" into the Patawalonga after three-quarter time.

It was confirmed late last night that at least seven players had returned to camp with acceptable excuses.

They were ruckmen Colin MacVicar and Mike Doszna, centreman John Cummins, follower John Girardi, rover Johnny O'Connor, and wingmen Rod Allen and Brian Winstanley.

Four other players — half-back Eddie Richter, rover Phil Maylin, half-forward Ralph Sewer, and back pocket Eddie Holland — are reported to be on their way back to camp and will be readmitted.

The other seven (the two reserves already have been excused) could be regarded as doubtful for next Saturday's game against Port at Football Park.

What about Glenelg? — Well, they were in trouble at half-time, because of

their inaccurate kicking for goal in the first quarter (3-9), their seemingly casual approach at times, AND Woodville's fighting second quarter (6-7 to 2-2) when the 'Peckers, with commendable determination and fluent use of handball, stole the game away from the Tigers.

That was the end of Woodville's challenge!

Glenelg, presumably stirred by coach Neil Kerley at half-time, completely dominated the second half.

Full forward Fred Phillis marking powerfully and drop-kicking accurately, kicked six of his seven goals (three in each of the last two quarters).

In the end, it was probably Glenelg's superior fitness, as much as their greater depth of talent, that won them the game.

Umpire Colin Steinert, who seemed strangely reluctant to pay free kicks, but was quick to award marks, won few votes from either side after the game.

FOOTNOTE: In winning, Glenelg have cured coach Kerley's insomnia. Kerl has suffered from nightmares since the loss to Woodville earlier in the season. His wife, Barbara, confirmed late last night Neil is sleeping soundly again!

# Giant Eagle quits

Torrens' ruckman Wayne Miller has retired from league football.

Miller, 28, and 6 ft. 4 in. has been forced to quit because of a nagging back injury and troublesome feet.

He was unavailable for Torrens' game against Centrals at Elizabeth yesterday.

Miller, a truck driver, pinched nerves in his back at work early this year and was forced to miss the first six games this season. "My back has been giving me hell," Miller said. "It's been murder sometimes after training and games."

"Last Saturday it was really bad. I couldn't train on Tuesday night. I've had chilblain trouble with my feet, too."

Miller, who played 101 league games, said he intended to "coach up the river" next season.
