Glenelg had the chances to steal the game in the dying minutes of time-on . . . but maybe that old killer instinct is fading from last year's undisputed champions.

The nine-goal burst by Torrens in the first quarter speaks for itself. It was brilliant football — and considerably surprising — from a team of underdogs.

Late mark

Aldo Floreani three times dropped in from his wing for three goals to the Eagles. With McKenzie controlling the rucks and Hunt active in the goal-square the Tigers found it hard to put the ball their way.

It took them until the 14 minute mark before Greg Wickens put their first goal on the board.

But nobody really thought the Bays would lose. Most were waiting for their run to start and that of the Eagles to halt.

When Terry Homan and John Keast collided when going for a mark late in the quarter Torrens could have become unsettled.

When he returned Fred Phillis had goaled twice and it looked as if the Tigers were starting their expected run.

But the Eagles were still breaking away from the diamond and with Floreani giving Peter Millard the run around on the wing there was still nothing in it.

Few mistakes

It was only the battling Graham Cornes and the rugged Wayne Phillis who were keeping the Bays in it.

Fred Phillis was making few mistakes when the ball came his way — but

his counterpart, Adrian Hunt, was doing exactly the same at the opposite end.

The third term left supporters on both sides wondering after Torrens had kicked 4.5 and Glenelg 4.3.

The Bays came back in the final term with two goals — one to Colin Anderson and the other to Fred Phillis from a doubtful free.

Glenelg were four points up, but still the Eagles were not giving in. Greg White notched 11 of his 26 kicks in this term.

At the 10 minute mark Kluzek took a handpass from Hunt for a goal and the Eagles were again two points clear.

Bennett grabbed one off hands for the Bays, goaled, and it was Glenelg again.

But the tide changed when Torrens goaled through Hunt and Roberts.

With time on remaining the Tigers had the chance to snatch the lead several times but failed.
