DAVIES DESTROYED BAY REVIVAL

Sturt ruckman Rick Davies had 64 touches of the ball in the match against Glenelg at the Bay yesterday—and that told the story.

He had 18 kicks, 29 hitouts, 17 handballs, 13 marks and kicked one goal.

Glenelg looked threatening to Sturt in the third term. At the final change the Bays trailed by 12 points.

That was when Davies really lifted.

"I thought we were in trouble then," Davies said after the game.

"So I thought that if I could, I should really get stuck into it — and the game starts at the centre bounces."

"I was lucky enough to get some taps that opened it up."

Luck had nothing to do with it.

Glenelg kicked themselves out of the game in

the first half. It was the 19-minute mark of the second term before Colin Anderson took a fine mark and kicked his side's first goal.

Players could have been excused for poor kicking.

The oval was very heavy and the centre diamond area was so muddy that Sturt rover Nunan ran into one patch and disappeared.

After a quick search they found him and the game resumed.

That mud could well have added to Sturt's avenues of attack.

Howard, who played a great game in the centre, was covered from head to toe in black mud. Time and again Glenelg players shot handballs to the Sturt man, mistaking him for one of their team mates.

Nelson put in a great defender's game and Wild combined with Davies and rovers Nunan and Barton to form an unbeatable ruck combination.

Whelan started the game badly, kicking points and out-of-bounds from relatively easy shots.

But he pulled up his socks and finished with five goals.

He took one of the best marks I have seen for some time.

MacFarlane was easily Glenelg's best. He played well for four quarters.

Wayne Phillis started slowly but played an excellent third quarter.

Anderson kicked Glenelg's first four goals and Wickens booted four — three in the final term.

One thing that came out of the game was the problem caused by the centre diamond when there is a mud patch.

In the old system the centre could be moved away from mud patches—but with the diamond this is not possible.

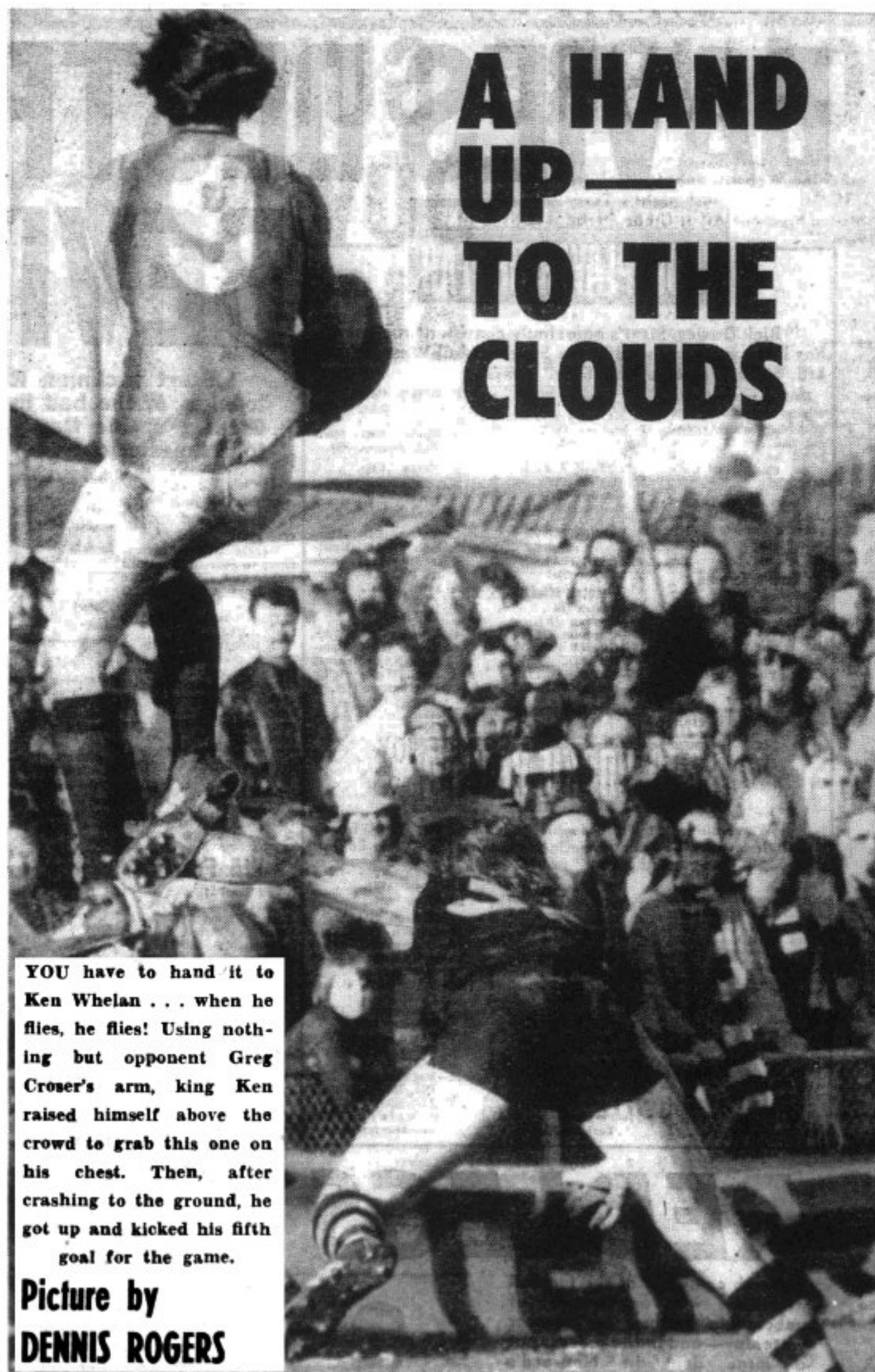
