

2 REPORTS AT BAY

A player from each team was reported in the fiery clash between Centrals and Glenelg at the Bay yesterday.

Glenelg wingman Peter Millard was reported in the first quarter for allegedly striking Graham Reed in the face with an elbow.

Centrals' rover Barry Norsworthy was reported in the last quarter for allegedly striking Glenelg rover Rex Voigt. Both reports were made by boundary umpires.

Glenelg, with dominant rucks and rovers and a better centre-line, overpowered the Bulldogs by 42 points. Final scores were Glenelg 19-15 to Centrals 13-9.

It was difficult to understand the tactics of Centrals captain-coach, Tony Casserly, in playing two rovers on the ball.

He did this from the first bounce and it left Glenelg back-pocketman

Steve Hywood loose across the back line.

Time and again Hywood sent the ball back into attack for Glenelg — and his passes were accurate, creating many opportunities.

Glenelg were clearly superior on the day but their game fell away in the last quarter.

It was interesting to see Centrals coach Tony Casserly come off the field at half-time.

"I was playing badly and did not deserve my place on the field at that stage," Casserly said afterwards.

High scores

South's 21-13 (139) against Port at Adelaide yesterday was the second highest losing score in league history.

Highest losing score is Woodville's 23-8 (146) against South at Adelaide in the second series last season.

Port, who won by 27 points, and South kicked a phenomenal 20-8 in the third quarter — Port 13-6 and South 7-2.

It is believed to be the highest scoring quarter in league history.

The aggregate points for the match — 305 — was 20 points fewer than the highest scoring game in league history — 325 by Glenelg and North at the Bay in 1937.

At Thebarton, North hung on to beat Torrens by 17 points after the Eagles had staged a startling second-half recovery.

Torrens played woefully in the first half and trailed by 50 points at half-time. Then they rammed on 12-7 to North's 6-10 in the second half.

For North, the result was a big improvement on their six-goal loss to Sturt last week.

For Torrens, it was a disappointing end to their winning run this year.

•WAS it a goal or a mark? The goal umpire said Glenelg full-back Peter Anderson got his hands on the ball in front of the goal posts, and it was therefore a mark and no goal. But Mail photographer Dennis Rogers caught Anderson standing on the back of Centrals' forward John "Spog" Wylie. Either way it was a great display of eyes on the ball!

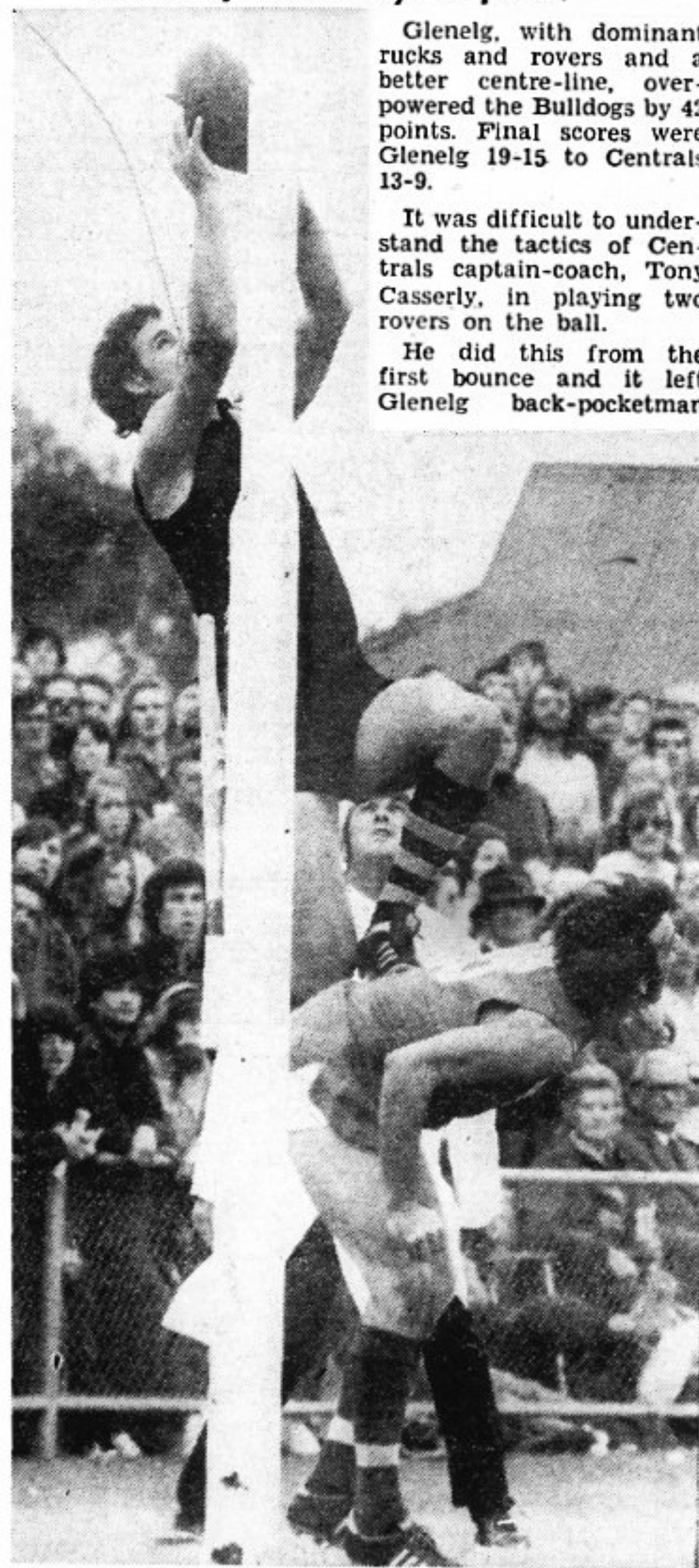
