Many people went to Football Park yesterday to see Glenelg and Sturt play—and went home with cricked necks.

Half their time was spent gazing into the sky waiting for Graham Cornes, Peter Carey or Ken Whelan to come down.

Cornes must have thought he was inflated the way he kept soaring.

Time and again Cornes stuck his knees and boots on opponents' shoulders and just kept going up.

His marks rightly drew "ooohs" and aaaahs" from the crowd.

Carey and Whelan had their moments, too, but the "high-flier's" award on the day was Cornes'.

Sturt held off a determined Glenelg to run out winners by 17 points.

The first quarter was very even — with some fine football.

Right from the bounce it was obvious the crowd was in for a feast of duels between opposing players.

Some of the more obvious duels were between Hamilton and Howard in the centre, Colbey and Graham on the flank and between the rucks.

When the half-time siren went one point separated the sides.

Sturt coach Jack Oatey must have stirred up his boys during the break — particularly the centre-line.

It was Burgan, Howard and Miels that finally created the chink in the Bay armor.

Howard played a boomer of a second half, completely blanketing Hamilton. Burgan and Miels created countless attacks for their forwards.

MacFarlane was not disgraced and played virtually on one leg.

Met match

Barton played a brilliant last half, and Nunan seemed to be where he was needed most when the Bays were making their home run.

Davies met his match in fardif at centre bounces and boundary throw ins.

The Sturt star was far from disgraced and did much more work around the ground than Tardif.

Colbey played a great game on a tough opponent.

Graham was one of Sturt's good players and did some very handy things when the pressure was on in the last term.

Casey, Nelson and Murphy all played well, particularly when the Bay players started kicking the ball wildly into the air in the second term.

Whelan and Fred Phillis put in good games, and both missed goals that they should have kicked.

Wild left the field in the second term and is in doubt for next week with a recurrent leg injury.
