IT'S EAGLES!

Torrens will play in the SANFL finals series for the first time since 1969.

The Eagles squeezed Centrals out of the five by beating Woodville yesterday.

Port helped Torrens' bid by trouncing the Bulldogs at Football Park. The final five is—Sturt, Port, Norwood, Glenelg and Torrens.

Next Saturday Port will play Norwood at Football Park and Glenelg will play Torrens at Adelaide Oval, the loser dropping out of the finals.

The following Saturday the winner of the Glenelg-Torrens clash will play the loser of the Port-Norwood match.

Sturt will play the winner of the Port-Norwood game.

Big Port ruckman Leon Milde was admitted to the Western Districts Community Hospital suffering from concussion after the Port-Centrals game.

Milde went down in the first five minutes when he was met heavily by Centrals wingman Peter Vivian.

After being attended by four trainers for several minutes and examined by the Port doctor, he was carried semi-conscious from the ground and replaced by Bob Kings-ton.

Port secretary, Mr. Bob McLean, said after the game that it was hoped Milde would make a quick recovery and be fit in time for next week's game against Norwood.

Magpie rover Brian Cunningham limped from the ground early in the second term with a corked thigh, but he should be ready for next week.

ENERGY SAVER AT THE PARADE

It was all so gentle and friendly as Norwood wended their way to a 30-point win over Glenelg at the Parade.

The margin was just about right—Norwood's resources were greater on the day and they led virtually from start to finish.

There was no way any one was going to get hurt in the process.

It was as if the two clubs had got together and decided that each should not knock themselves about, but save up the energy for next week's start to the major round.

A Glenelg official after the game called it a "program filler."

All this was a bit hard to take after the fire and brimstone meeting between the two sides at Football Park on July 13 (Glenelg won by 40 points then).

Most of the action yesterday came in the last minute of the game.

Michael Olsen began the sequence by vehemently disagreeing with a decision of umpire Bob Scholefield (a lot of spectators spent most of the day doing that).

Then Philip Carman (smiling) rubbed Graham Cornes' face in the wet turf twice and finally Kerry Hamilton pushed Phil Gallagher away (hand in face) from a "confrontation."

There was little between the two sides to half-time when the Redlegs led by 10 points.

Glenelg were able to keep within touch for most of the two hours mainly because of their winning half-back line.

Wayne Phillis' strong body kept the mercurial Phil Carman in check.

while Roger Woodcock's brilliant dash from the right half-forward flank was not nearly so conspicuous as usual.

There was still scope for the Carman class.

He had two beautiful goals — the first a "banana ball" back-screw punt from down in front of the scoreboard and then a spectacular hook over his left shoulder while running away from goal.

Norwood early in the day began well in the rucks and they built on that.

The Redlegs were steadier and had superior balance around the 18 players.

Glenelg missed Peter Carey's centre half-forward finesse and prolific kick-getter John MacFarlane — who spent the day on the bench while keeping himself for next week's elimination final.

\$500 'PLAYER OF YEAR'

Sturt ruckman Rick Davies has won the Sunday Mail-West Lakes Ltd. \$500 "Player of the Year" award by a convincing 13 points.

Davies, with another best-of-field performance yesterday, finished the minor round with 33 votes — 13 clear of Torrens utility, Ian Wallace, and Port captain-centremen, Russell Ebert.

Wallace received the maximum votes at Woodville yesterday, and Ebert was awarded two votes at Football Park. Norwood star Phil Carman and Woodville centreman John Cummins finished the season with 19 votes, only one behind Wallace and Ebert, but 14 behind Davies.

One point further back were North skipper Barrie Robran and Sturt centreman Brendon Howard.

But it was Davies' year, according to the Sunday Mail writers.
