Firebrand Torrens coach, Billy Barrot, only saw his charges kick one goal at Football Park today—their last—and by that time Glenelg were well on their way to a 44-point win.

For the first three quarters Barrot buried his head in his hands every time a Torrens player had a shot for goal.

The roar of the crowd was the signal for him to lift his head and look towards the man waving the white flags.

Glenelg won the game in the first quarter—nearly threw it away in the second and third—then came back like a premiership contender when the chips were down in the last term.

Glenelg started the game looking like a top side as they moved the ball around the ground with good kicking and precision handball.

Kerry Hamilton was a driving force at centre, Peter Carey was dominant in ruck, and Butch Phillis moved the ball around the forward lines like a traffic cop.

With John Sandland providing the spearhead, the Tigers jumped seven points up before Torrens replied with a goal from Aldo Floreani.

Goals to Steve Pavlich and Sandland followed as the sides matched stride for stride, but then umpire Bob Scholefield intervened.

Poured on the pressure

Kicking against the wind the Bays poured on the pressure and ran to a three goal lead at the first change, despite a goal on the siren from Eaglet Bob Alexander.

The Eagles jumped Glenelg in the second term, with Greg White and Floreani providing the drive across centre, and big Bazza McKenzie thumping the leather in ruck.

Glenelg came back through Rex Voigt and Wayne Phillis, but Steve Pavlich and Alexander pushed the Eagles to within four points at the big break.

Torrens used the wind well in the third term booting the ball long and high to kick four straight goals.

The result was Glenelg kicked 1.9 for the term, and Torrens led by 15 points at the last change.

A desperate Torrens sortie into the wind from the centre bounce was repulsed by the Glenelg defence, and from then last year's premiers showed their class.

Greg Wickens, Peter Marker, John McFarlane, Greg Bennett and Sandland jumped on a goal scoring bandwagon, slamming on 9-4 in a display of power football that would have floored most sides.

"We lacked the experience to finish them off," was Bill Barrot's comment at the end of the game.
