SYDNEY: Coach Mike Patterson pledged last night that South Australia would play "a different game" against Victoria in the interstate football match at the Sydney Cricket Ground today.

"We'll be more direct this time than we were against Western Australia a fortnight ago," Patterson said.

"Time is the essence of the contract in games against Victoria.

"We'll be employing a direct, play-on game.

"The side that makes the least number of mistakes will win.

"We're very determined it's a long time—too long, since we've beaten Victoria.

"We have everything going for us—a good side, a neutral ground, a neutral umpire."

Patterson said he would not be talking with WA umpire Ross Capes before the game about the so-called check-side tactics likely to be used by SA ruckmen Rick Davies and Dean Ottens.

"There's no such thing as check-side," Patterson said. "You either shepherd or you don't."

Direct way best—Patto

SA captain **Barrie Robran** said: "There's no reason why we shouldn't win."

"I realise it's always hard against Victoria, but we have an in-form, well-balanced side capable of playing a good team game," said Robran.

He named Victorian ruckmen **Len Thompson** and **Gary Dempsey** as always being a danger to SA.

Victorian coach **Neil Mann** said he was "terribly concerned" that SA already had played together this season.

"It's my main concern that our boys play together as a true team," Mann said.

"I've stressed the getting together theme at training this week.

"We have a young side,

but it's a form side. "I'm confident we can win."

Victorian captain **Len Thompson** said: "This is a very, very good Victorian side, certainly as good as any I've played in."

"I'm confident we will have the ability and attitude to win.

"I think we'll gain an ascendancy from our followers **Kevin Sheedy** and **John Murphy**, and rovers **Kevin Bartlett** and **Leigh Matthews**.

"We have the best half-back line that could be picked in Australia (**Gary Hardeman**, **Bernie Quinlan**, and **Max Richardson**), the best full back in Australia (**Geoff Southby**), and the best half-forward flanker in Australia (**David Clarke**)."

Tiny Nunan. Guts in his second name. He took on everyone who went near him. Throwing his 5 st-

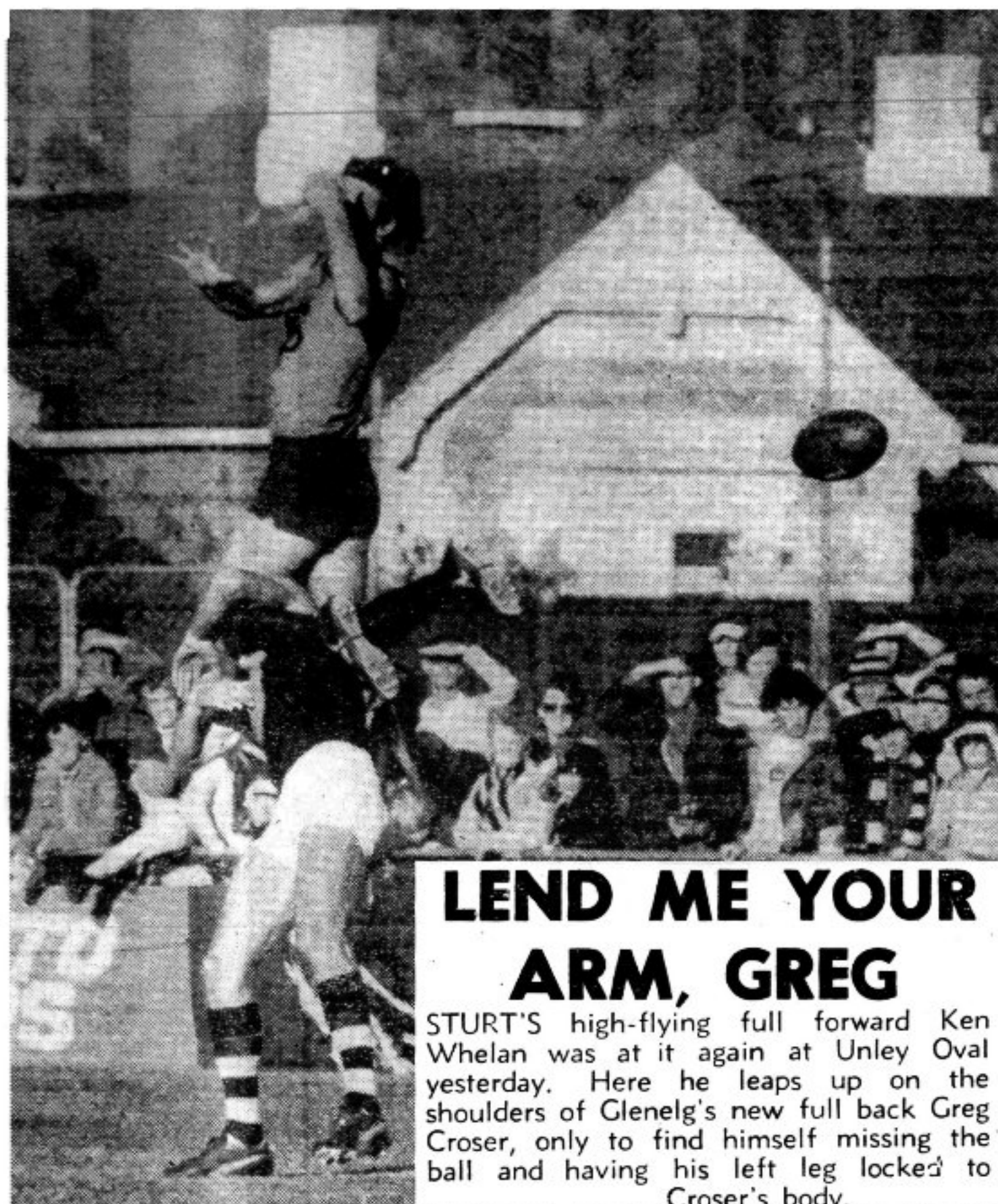
nothing weight around as if he were a 17-stone centre-half back.
