EASY — BUT BAYS PAY

6 INJURED IN PARK BATTLE

Glenelg trounced Norwood at Football Park yesterday, but paid dearly for their success.

Six Tiger stars were injured in the match — but fortunately only two are in doubt for next week.

Centre half-forward Peter Carey was concussed and may miss next week. Colin Anderson has an injured ankle and could be out next week.

The other Glenelg crocks are captain Peter Marker (ankle), ruckman Bob Tardif (calf muscle), wingman

John MacFarlane (ankle), and Neville Caldwell (mild concussion).

But the way the Tigers went in it was inevitable that some of them were going to be bruised after the game.

Woodville wingman Rodney Allen has a serious knee injury and is doubtful for next week.

The Pecker injured his lateral ligaments in his left leg and was carried from Elizabeth Oval on a stretcher during the third quarter.

Centrals' Dean Mobbs hurt an ankle and did not resume after half-time.

Sturt half-forward Malcolm Greenslade was injured in the first quarter and left the ground. He has a corked thigh.

Torrens ruckman Barry McKenzie hurt his shoulder and left the ground in the second quarter.

Norwood rover Greg Turbill will be the first league player to face the tribunal this season.

Turbill was reported by central umpire Bennet for allegedly striking Glenelg's Neville Caldwell in the second quarter of the Football Park clash.

That's the message the Tigers are getting in 1975. Scrag, smother, shepherd . . . throw yourself at the ball or a rival player.

It took Glenelg a quarter really to master yesterday, but once it got going Norwood didn't get a chance to recover.

Glenelg sealed the game with five goals at the start of the third quarter. The five goals were booted in nine minutes and gave the Tigers an almost unbeatable lead.

A disappointing crowd of 12,577 saw the game. I would have expected 20,000.

Norwood started well with plenty of run, keeping the ball low and putting it in front of their men. The Norwood backline was steady and coming out of attack they kicked to position well.

Then the message went out to the Glenelg forwards—"when the opposition have the ball you become backmen."

And the game changed dramatically. The Norwood backmen who had been delivering the ball well to the centreline players, suddenly found themselves under extreme pressure. Their kicks were skied and the big Glenelg side revelled in the high balls.

Tardif started the ball rolling with solid ruck

work. He and Norwood's Gregg were the best ruckmen on the ground. The two were rarely on the ball together.

Glenelg's Bennett roved tirelessly for four quarters and was the best player on the ground. He had 33 kicks and seven handballs, and each of his kicks was delivered to a teammate.

Turbill started brilliantly and had the crowd on its feet with a strong mark in the opening minutes. But he died out of the game and was treated after the match for a corked calf muscle.

Ever-reliable Colbey was well on top of Nicholson on the flank. Colbey is another player who may get 20 kicks a game — and every one of them creates an attack for his side.

HARD DAY FOR SPEEDSTERS

The centre battle between Taylor and Marker was fairly even. Marker was perhaps a shade more effective.

Kerley and Carey had a great tussle. Carey was concussed during the game and this would have made the Norwood man's job easier. Kerley beat Carey.

Croser and Dillon had a keen battle. Dillon was

a winning cog in the Redleg side in the first half, but Croser pegged him back admirably after half-time.

The speedsters MacFarlane and Gallagher worked hard all day. Norwood's Gallagher was carried from the field shortly before the siren with a "bruised foot."

Although Fred Phillis booted 4-2 I thought Poulter did a fair job. The ball was often put on Phillis' chest, making it impossible for Poulter to do anything but stand the mark as the Glenelg man shot for goal.

Glenelg are a strong and fast side and for Norwood to be beaten by them is no shame.

The thing that would have hurt Norwood supporters was the way in which the Redlegs apparently dropped their bundle in the last quarter.

No side tries to lose, but many Norwood players just watched as Glenelg attacked time and again in that last term.
