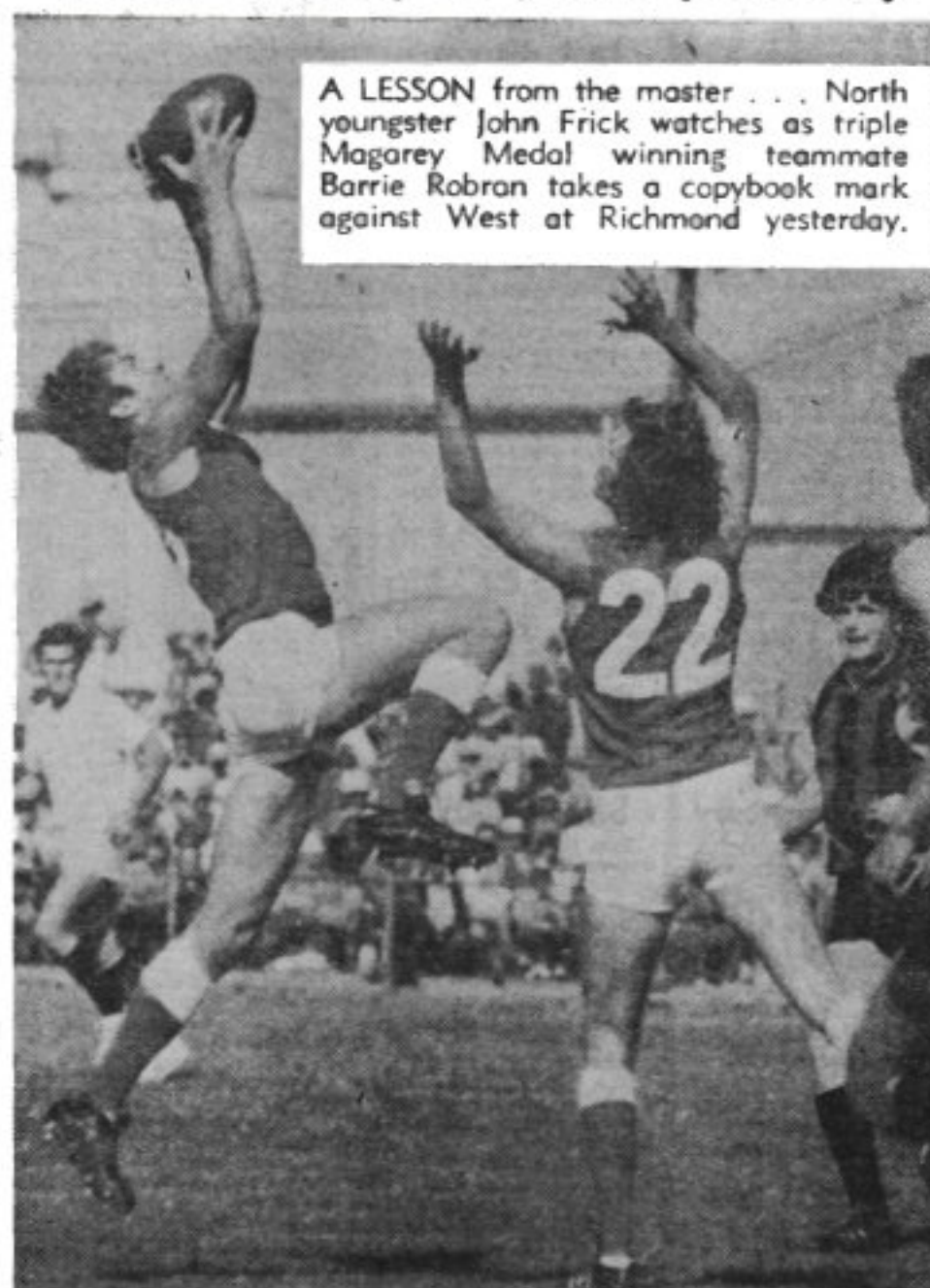

Woodville beat Torrens at Woodville for the first time since 1967 and the loss so upset Torrens' coach Noel Teasdale that the former Pecker closed the doors for 10 minutes after the game while he talked to his players.

Centrals' captain Bill Cochrane has a badly bruised shin. He injured his leg during the third quarter of the Bulldogs match with South at Elizabeth.

Cochrane could be doubtful next week.

North back pocket Charlie Payne has a corked thigh and is doubtful for next Saturday.

Payne injured his thigh in the second quarter and did not resume after half-time.

Deards could miss 6

East Perth recruit Ken Deards suffered a depressed fracture of the left cheek bone playing for West Adelaide against North Adelaide in the second quarter of the Reserves match at Richmond Oval today.

Deards, a half-back flanker and back pocket player, could be out of football for six weeks.

It was a cruel blow for

West, who were looking to the rugged Deards to stiffen their defence.

Today's game was his first since 1973. He missed all of last season through injury, and a torn hamstring muscle prevented him playing in any of West's pre-season trial games and last Saturday's opening series.

West gained clearances for Deards and crack utility player John Hayes in a joint deal with East Perth some weeks ago.
