Club silent on Miels

Sturt wingman, Brenton Miels, was reported during the clash with West at Unley yesterday but no one's saying why.

The 25-year-old star, in his tenth season of league football with Sturt, was told by houndary umpire Brian Matheson of the report as players left the ground at half-time.

Sturt officials would not release details of the report but Sunday Mail football writer Terry Williams, who was at the game, said the report involved a clash between Miels and West hal back Robert Donaldson as they battled for a mark in front of the Sturt VIP stand.

Williams said Sturt officials told him: "We have a report. It is Miels."

At Football Park in the match be-

Centrals lost wingman Richard Cochrane in the third quarter after he clashed heavily, but fairly, with Torrens' Harry Puhle.

Cochrane was carried from the ground on a stretcher and taken to the Lyell McEwin Hospital with concussion and severe bruising.


