Club silent on Miels

Sturt wingman, Brenton Miels, was reported during the clash with West at Unley yesterday but no one's saying why.

The 25-year-old star, in his tenth season of league football with Sturt, was told by boundary umpire Brian Matheson of the report as players left the ground at half-time.

Sturt officials would not release details of the report but Sunday Mail football writer Terry Williams, who was at the game, said the report involved a clash between Miels and West half-back Robert Donaldson as they battled for a mark in front of the Sturt VIP stand.

Williams said Sturt officials told him: "We have a report. It is Miels." At Football Park in the match be-

tween Centrals and Torrens, two star players were badly hurt.

Centrals lost wingman Richard Cochrane in the third quarter after he clashed heavily, but fairly, with Torrens' Harry Puhle.

Cochrane was carried from the ground on a stretcher and taken to the Lyell McEwin Hospital with concussion and severe bruising.

In the last quarter Torrens' centre half-forward Brian Mulvihill crashed to the ground and did not move.

Trainers carried him from the ground on a stretcher. He has torn ligaments in his left calf.

\$500 'PLAYER OF YEAR'

Woodville ruckman, Colin MacVicar, is the main rival to Glenelg captain, Peter Marker, in the \$500 West Lakes Ltd. Player of the Year Award.

MacVicar, with three votes for a best-on-ground performance moved into second spot behind Marker, who was rated third best afield in the clash between Woodville and Glenelg yesterday.

Marker now leads with 10 points, polled in four matches and including three best-on-ground votes, with MacVicar three behind on seven.

The remaining votes were well spread around with Ross Dillon (Nor-

You also may say that the game should have been only an exercise gallop for the Bays.

Well it wasn't, and Tiger coach Neil Kerley must have been a little worried by the Peckers fierce approach and their unwill-

ingness to give away two premierships points.

Glenelg had to fight just as hard to win, as they did against premiers Sturt last week.

Take out captain Peter Marker (30 kicks), Wayne Phillis (10 marks), Peter Carey (13 marks) and it could have been a boiler. The game was played in

perfect conditions with Woodville attacking incessantly in the first quarter.

All they could do was kick points, but they still surprised Glenelg by leading by three points at the change.

MacVicar was supreme at ruck, taking on Cornes, Carey, and Wayne Phillis and beating them all.

The second quarter saw a furious Tiger stung into action.

Captain Marker grabbed control at centre, travelling far and wide for kicks, to drive the Bays in.

Colbey on back flank was his usual impassable self and with Fred Phillis making the most of his limited opportunities, Glenelg won the game in this quarter.

They led by 24 points at half-time.

The third quarter could have been scrapped. It produced defensive football with Glenelg increasing their lead.

Boyanich, who didn't seem to appreciate the centre half-forward position, was placed at full forward after half-time.

He could do well to forget the second and third quarters when he didn't get a kick.

It was a different story in the first 10 minutes of the last quarter with Woodville making an all out attack.

Boyanich grabbed two or three marks and steered through a six pointer. Coudraye kicked one and Woodville were only 21 points down and playing well.

This was where Glenelg proved they were premier-ship contenders.

Anderson rebounded from full back to Caldwell who shot a pass to Hodge- man walling in the square and the Tigers were home.

They didn't relent, Hodgeman kicked another, then Phillis, Cornes and Colin Anderson popped through some more and Glenelg won by eight goals.
