Woodville ruckman Jim Brenton has a broken arm and will miss at least 10 matches.

Brenton broke his left ulna in the second quarter of the match against Sturt at Woodville Oval yesterday.

BRENTON WILL MISS 10-BROKEN ARM

Brenton, who first played league for the Peckers in 1972, was taken to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital where his arm was set.

Glenelg were the only other team with seriously injured players.

Ruckman Wayne Phillis has a hamstring injury and may miss a match. He left the ground at quarter time.

Star half-back Brian Colbey also left the field in the last quarter. He has a badly bruised knee and could also be doubtful for the League Cup series next week.

TURBILL HURTS ANKLE

At Elizabeth Norwood rover Greg Turbill left the ground in the last quarter with an injured ankle. He is certain to be rested during the Cup matches next week.

Bays, but it wasn't a picnic

Glenelg handed out a 45-point football lesson to South Adelaide at the Adelaide Oval yesterday.

But, they showed they are far from unbeatable!

Glenelg won the game in the first half, with Fred Phillis firing up front and booting 6-2 in a power-packed display at the goal-front.

The second half of the game was a dismal affair, marred by light rain, with both sides fumbling and stumbling in the slippery Adelaide Oval conditions.

From the opening bounce South took control across centre, with Mark Coombe and Geoff Baynes picking up a ton of kicks.

However, it was Glenelg who did the scoring as Phillis piled on two goals and "Twiggy" Caldwell one, in an opening burst that left the Panthers floundering.

Big John Schneebichler started the South machine rolling with two goals, and then the sides played top brand football. They swung the ball from end to end for the Bays to eventually sit on a seven-point lead at the first-change.

Phillis had brought up his third goal shortly before the term ended, and the South defence was having a hard time holding him.

The second term was a repetition of the first with Glenelg pouncing early and then South coming back.

DRIVE

Combe, David Young, Graham Robbins and Baynes were giving the small men drive to keep South in the game, while Glenelg controlled the air.

Phillis got two more early goals before the Panthers switched Phil Reimann to full back, removing some of the lethal power from the Glenelg goalfront, and the rain did the rest.

Peter Marker was slowly starting to warm up at the pivot for Glenelg, and big Peter Carey could do nothing wrong in defence or on the ball as the Tigers went 28 points clear at the big change.

The third term opened with South piling on three quick goals in six minutes, getting to within 10 points of the premiership leaders.

Four goals to time on, many missed chances, and Glenelg were sitting on an unbeatable 29 point lead at the last change.

The end came with Mark Coombe kicking a goal for South, in what was yet another effort from the Panther small brigade.
