PANTHER MAGIC GIVES BOOST

South, convincing losers in their first four games, breathed much-needed life into the league football competition with an unforgettable 11-point triumph over Sturt at Unley yesterday.

It was one of the biggest upsets for years and the Panthers' first success at Unley for 17 years.

Had Sturt been able to get up and win—they had chances in a thrilling last quarter—justice would not have been done.

The Panthers were just too good and had the Blues' measure in all but the third quarter.

South's dressing room resembled that of a winning finals' side immediately after the game.

A collection was made for all players and it will be continued at Panther Park today when jubilant members and supporters will replay every one of those 19 winning goals.

South's shock win was a great boost for the club and the competition, although Sturt might see it differently.

The Blues slipped from fifth to sixth position as a result of their loss.

Centrals full back Wayne Bevan was reported in the match against Norwood at Football Park.

Bevan was reported by goal umpire R. Mules for allegedly attempting to strike Norwood full forward Jim Michalanne with a clenched right fist in the third quarter.

North, with Barrie Robran back to his dominant best, gave Port a fright at Adelaide Oval before succumbing by 20 points.

Disappointingly, West and Centrals did not get close enough to Glenelg and Norwood.

Spark missing in close contest

Glenelg wore off a nagging West Adelaide to take the game by seven goals at the Bay yesterday . . . but it wasn't the match the 9,610 people thought they were going to see.

The first half was good stuff, but the atmosphere wasn't there . . . and neither was the brilliance.

The game was tough, close football, but there was something missing.

But West had other ideas. They served it right up to the Tigers and were looking good right up until the time-on period of the second quarter.
