Seventeen thousand fans witnessed a football treat at Unley Oval yesterday when Jack Oatey's mighty Blues turned on the magic against Port.

..They wiped Port off the ground during a memorable second quarter when they slammed on 11 goals—six of them coming from the boot of football's Mr. Magic, Paul Bagshaw.

Bagshaw was the pin-up boy at Unley again last night, kicking 10-3 during the match to lift him to third on the leading goalkickers' list.

Sturt's game was a devastating display of precision football that fans will talk about for years.

"Oatey's Kings" read the banner the Blues ran through as they took the field, and Jack Oatey was king of Unley at the end of the day.

Five match records went during the game, which Sturt had won by half-time.

## 11-goal Glenelg burst

The runaway win by Sturt enforced their position at the head of the premiership table, and firmed their price as grand final hopefuls.

Port had no answer to the way the new-look Sturt side whisked the ball around their home ground, but the Magpies maintained their fourth position on the premiership table.

While Sturt were ripping Port apart in the second quarter at Unley, Glenelg were doing the same to Woodville at the Bay.

Glenelg started poorly, when Woodville jumped them in the opening quarter, but by half-time the Bays had reasserted themselves with a burst of power football that rattled on eleven goals and three points—one point less than the Sturt tally for the same quarter.

The other two games went as expected with Norwood and West both winning.

The seventh round of football will be completed today when Torrens meet Centrals at Thebarton.

It is a vital game for the Eagles, who must win if they are to have any chance of improving on their sixth position at the end of the 1977 season.

# 44-TOUCH KYM REAL KILLER

## Glenelg 23-20, Woodville 16-13

Kym Hodgeman, with a little help from his teammates, booted Glenelg to a big victory over Woodville.

Little Hodgeman, with a heart as big as himself, was footsore after helping himself to 34 kicks, eight marks and 10 handballs.

Add to that his 6-1 and you can see why he was head and shoulders above any other player on Glenelg Oval yesterday.

The Tigers produced brilliant football after their lethargic first quarter to record a comfortable 49-point win.

But to Woodville's credit they never gave up, and came back strongly in the last term, although it was obvious the game was Glenelg's.

In a sensational start, Glenelg's Neville Caldwell was knocked unconscious after being tackled heavily, but fairly, by Ralph Sewer in the first minute.

## Delivery

He was replaced by John MacFarlane, and

about the 15-minute mark the second stretcher was called for when Woodville's Phil Reimann went down with a dislocated knee.

The first term was all Woodville. They tackled fiercely, won the ruck and had Barry Tyrell firing through three goals at full forward.

But then it happened! Glenelg got things together and before the Peckers knew it the Bays had shovelled through 11 goals.

The bewildered Pecker players were suddenly five goals down at half-time.

The men responsible for Glenelg's avalanche were Hodgeman, Graham Cornes, Paul Weston, Darrel Rady and Stephen Copping.

Cornes has changed his game remarkably and yesterday played hard for the

ball, picking up 20 kicks and seven marks.

Weston cut the dynamic Ralph Sewer out of the game and on numerous occasions created opportunities up forward with his superb delivery of the ball.

Rady was dynamite on a half-forward flank and should have kicked more than two goals from his eight attempts and Copping notched five goals at full forward.

The Tigers continued their brilliant ball display with seven goals in the third quarter.

Woodville tried hard, but were beaten across centre and had only Tyrell to fire at up forward.

Woodville didn't pressure Glenelg after the first 30 minutes, and when they went goalwards, it was in a very haphazard way.

Pecker ruckman Barry Goodingham used his body strongly when going for the tap and had the better of former Woodville star Colin MacVicar.

Glenelg piled on 18 goals in two quarters of first class football, but there's still room for improvement and when they play four solid quarters it will take a super team to beat them.
