Seventeen thousand fans witnessed a football treat at Unley Oval yesterday when Jack Catey's mighty Blues turned on the magic against Port.

.. They wiped Port off the ground during a memorable second quarter when they slammed on 11 goals-six of them coming from the boot of football's Mr. Magic, Paul Bagshaw.

Bagshaw was the pin-up boy at Unley again last night, kicking 10-3 during the match to lift him to third on the leading goalkickers' list.

Sturt's game was a devastating display of precision football that fans will talk about for years.

The other two games went as expected with Norwood and West both winning.
