## SUPER SOUTH CLINCH REWARD

South Adelaide will play in the league football finals this year for only the fifth time in 40 years.

Haydn Bunton's Panthers booked a berth at Football Park in September by whipping Port Adelaide by 33 points at Adelaide Oval yesterday.

Top of the premiership table since the fifth round, South has won eight of its first 10 matches and can hardly miss this year's finals.

Another four wins from the remaining 12 minor round games should be sufficient to clinch a place in the final five.

South will do it easily. Since it finished second to Sturt in 1940, South has appeared in the finals only four times — top in 1964, third in 1965, fourth in 1966 and fourth again in 1977.

West Adelaide, which has won only one of its 10 matches, is the only team not in contention for the

finals. Sturt, runner-up last season, has plunged to ninth position, yet, with four wins, it is still only one win behind fifth-ranked Norwood.

### Significant

The Redlegs' mammoth 111-point crushing of West Torrens at Football Park probably was the most significant happening from a finals' viewpoint, to emerge from yesterday's tenth round.

Norwood is too good to miss the finals. I still believe it is the best team in the competition.

The Redlegs will be premiership favorites again within a matter of weeks.

Torrens may well be history. It certainly is if yesterday's pathetic display is any guide.

Glenelg's 50-point demolition of North Adelaide at the Bay Oval strongly suggests the Tigers have turned the corner and are ready to mount a successful charge on the final five.

## Bays poised for five

Glenelg established itself as a serious premiership threat yesterday when it crushed a ragged North Adelaide by 50 points at Glenelg Oval.

The Tigers are now perched half a game outside the top five.

Coach, players, officials and supporters alike are calling their disposal of North the best effort this year.

And it was the experienced "name" players who started and finish North's destruction.

Peter Carey at ruck and full forward, Paul Weston at centre half-back, Kym Hodgeman and Peter McInerney roving and Neville Caldwell on the ball did the damage.

North had no answer for the ruck talent Glenelg threw at them.

Although big Mick Redden played a fine game around the ground the hit out statistics tell the story. The Glenelg pair had an amazing 49 to North's 14.

Carey ignited Glenelg early with four goals, finished with six and ended up with 16 kicks and eight marks.

His and MacVicar's

dominance was due heavily to clever coaching from John Halbert.

Halbert used the two big men both at full forward and in the ruck. Carey stayed in the square for the entire first quarter and MacVicar did the same thing at the other end in the second term.

With nine goals between them it obviously worked. "We wanted someone in the square who could either grab it or feed it to the smaller players," Halbert said after the game.

"It worked well, the big fellows not only kicked nine, but the rovers picked up six between them as well," he said.

While those four were creating havoc up forward, Paul Weston shot back to his best form with a concentrated and tidy effort at centre half back.

He picked up 20 kicks and his rebound play was excellent as he ran the ball out of defence.
