Bulldogs fight, but Bays stand firm

Glenelg withstood a spirited last-quarter fightback by Central District for a creditable 11-point win at Football Park yesterday.

Outplayed for three quarters and trailing by 38 points, the Bulldogs exploded spectacularly to bang on 5-9 to 1-0 and trail by five points with only three minutes remaining.

Then Glenelg captain Paul Weston goaled to seal the result at the 30-minute mark.

It was a fitting finish for Weston, the best player afield over four quarters.

His work-rate at centre was prolific — 27 kicks, 12 handpasses, eight marks and two goals.

But centre half-forward Nev Caldwell was contained by Duckworth and Robbie Walter was held scoreless by Bill Cochrane.

Duckworth went to full forward and had a telling run on the ball in the last quarter.

While Glenelg received little from its key position forwards, Stephen Copping played well on his flank and David Frost, in his first full game after four on the interchange bench, sank six goals from half-forward right.

A smooth-moving left-footer, Frost showed remarkable composure under pressure. He has as big a future as the flying high mark he seized in the galsquare at the northern end.

Terrier

Kym Hodgeman was a terrier in the first half and John Paynter again stressed his potential. He will have an interesting tussle with Peter McInerney for the second roving berth.

Hodgeman went off in the third quarter after hurting his left thigh.

Glenelg has enough good players to win by a much bigger margin. That it didn't and was run over in the last quarter was a clear warning that Central is still in the premiership fight with a big chance.

But future success will not just happen for the Bulldogs. They must always be as competitive and desperate as they were for only one quarter yesterday.

Yet Central skipper Dean Mobbs, Weston's opponent, nearly stole the best-afield honors with a sensational last-quarter effort which inspired the Bulldogs to produce some of their best football of the season.

Mobbs' statistics were as impressive as those of Weston — 23 kicks, nine handpasses, four marks and four goals.

Central showed little of its customary flair and aggression in the first three quarters when Glenelg invariably was first to the ball and, as a result, enjoyed a generous run from field umpires Graham Hilton and Trevor Thomas.

This appeared to drain some of Central's confidence, but players were back to their brash, belligerent best in the last quarter, with Mobbs, John Duckworth, Peter Jonas, Mark Norsworthy and Mark Prior leading the way.

Frost runs, 'hot' — six goals

David "Jack" Frost ran "hot" at Football Park yesterday, hauling in this screamer over Central District half-back Stephen Boehm and booting six goals without a miss from his 10 kicks.

It was his first full league match after starting on the interchange bench in the past four games.

A second-year economist's student at Flinders University, Frost has graduated into league company through Glenelg's junior teams.

He was an outfielder with Glenelg Tigers, which won last summer's night baseball competition.

Linke turns back clock

South Adelaide full forward Geoff Linke turned the clock back almost 45 years to the day by kicking 11 goals against North Adelaide at Adelaide Oval yesterday.

C. C. "Diddy" Munro kicked 11 goals for South against North at Adelaide Oval on June 22, 1935.

Munro holds South's club record for the most goals in a match — 12 against Glenelg in 1936.

Linke has now scored 46-24 in 12 games this season.

South coach Hadyn Bunton predicted before the season started that Linke would notch 100 this year.

Statistician Ern Kolosche, who supplied the Munro details, also pointed out that West Torrens has the worst record of any club against Sturt since the 10-team competition began in 1964.

Torrens has won only three of its past 36 matches against Sturt since and including 1964.

The Eagles won their first five games this season but have won only three of their past seven games, failing against North, Port Adelaide, Woodville and Sturt.

Torrens won its first three matches last season but finished the minor round in eighth position after winning only six of the other 19 games. — ALAN SHIELL
