

## Linke turns back clock

South Adelaide full forward Geoff Linke turned the clock back almost 45 years to the day by kicking 11 goals against North Adelaide at Adelaide Oval yesterday.

C. C. "Diddy" Munro kicked 11 goals for South against North at Adelaide Oval on June 22, 1935. Munro holds South's

club record for the most goals in a match -- 12 against Glenelg in 1936. Linke has now scored 46-24 in 12 games this

season. South coach Hadyn Bunton predicted before the season started that Linke would notch 100 this

year.

Statistician Ern Kolosche, who supplied the Munro details, also pointed out that West Torrens has the worst record of any club against Sturt since the 10-team competition began in 1964.

Torrens has won only three of its past 36 matches against Sturt since and including 1964.

The Eagles won their first five games this season but have won only three of their past seven games. failing against North. Port Adelaide, Woodville and Sturt.

Torens won its first three matches last season but finished the minor round in eighth position after winning only six of the other 19 games. — ALAN SHIELL
