Port Adelaide and Glenelg are certain to topple the Bay Oval attendance record of 17,171 when they clash in the match of the season on Saturday.

If the game were at Football Park, the crowd figure would be more than 30,000.

They'll be hanging from the rafters at the Brighton Rd ground as Port and Glenelg slog it out in a fight that may well decide the minor premiership.

The record Glenelg Oval crowd figure was established when the Tigers played Sturt on July 20, 1968.

Maximum interest in this week's battle was guaranteed yesterday when Port's awesome power enabled it to blitz Sturt in the last quarter at Football Park and win by 63 points.

And Glenelg also streaked away from Norwood for a 32 point victory at the Parade.

In their previous clash this season — at Football Park in the seventh round — Port beat Glenelg by 51 points after kicking 8-4 to 1-2 in the last quarter, before a crowd of 18,646.

Port, which drew with Central District at Elizabeth in the first match of the season, has lost only one match — to Sturt by four points at Unley in the sixth round.

Failed twice

Glenelg has failed only twice — against West Torrens by 10 points at Adelaide Oval in the fourth round, then against Port.

Glenelg and Port are expected to be at full strength on Saturday.

Glenelg escaped unscathed from the Norwood match yesterday and Port had one casualty — rover Darrell Cahill, who had 10 stitches in a badly gashed left calf.

Port's club doctor said last night that Cahill would play against Glenelg.

It is indicative of the two teams' great spread of talent that they have provided 11 players to the State side this year—Port's Russell Ebert, Brian Cunningham, Tim Evans, Mark Williams, Greg Phillips and

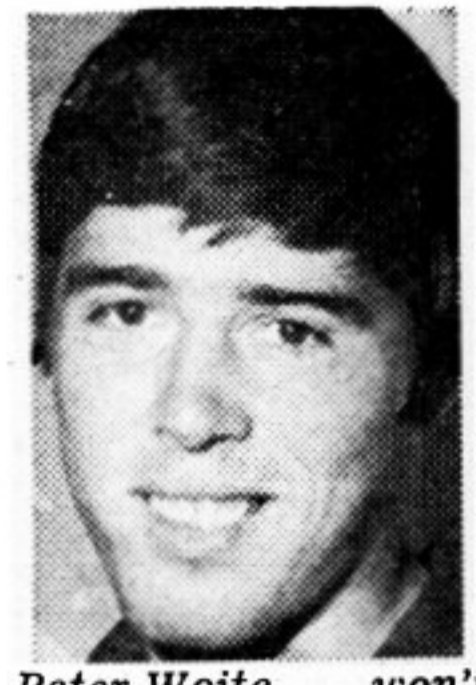

Glenelg is not expected to take a chance with key forward Peter Woite, who has not played for eight weeks because of an arthritic condition in his knees.

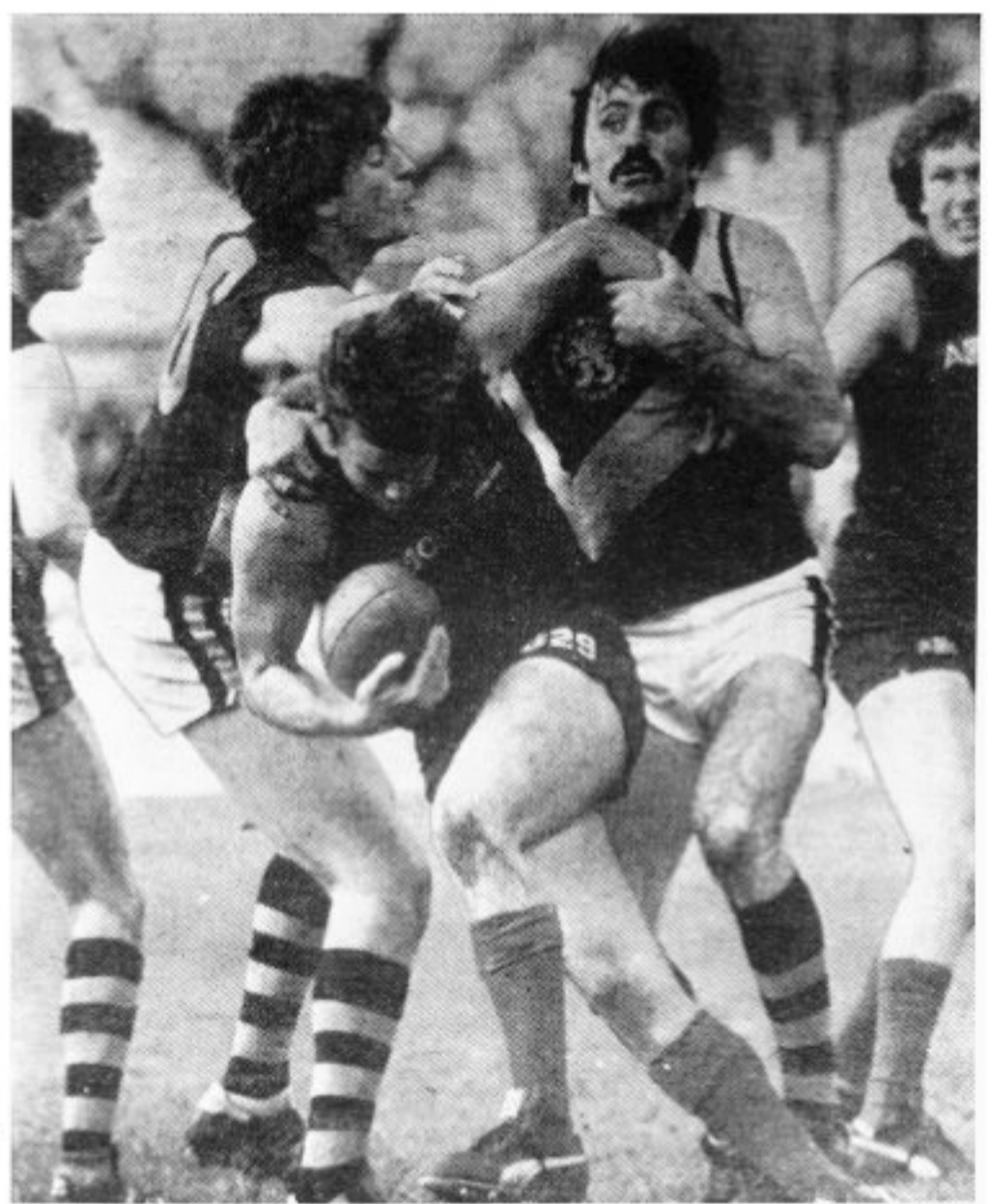
Woite reportedly is close to resuming, but he probably will be given at least one run with the Reserves before being considered for a league berth.

Torrens' 28-point loss to North Adelaide at Prospect yesterday has weakened the Eagles' claims to third position, which Central and Sturt are eyeing keenly.

Statistician Ern Kolosche said last night Torrens had now lost 25 of its last 29 matches against North. Torrens' last win at Prospect was in 1966.

Glenelg 18-14 (122), Norwood 12-18 (90)

Glenelg trampled Norwood into the Parade by 32 points yesterday.

Glenelg was superior in nearly every department and look more than capable of being in the grand final come October.

There was fierce desire for possession, plenty of constructive football and generally a display which oozed confidence.

In comparison Norwood lacked the finesse needed and was not direct enough in finding the easiest path to goal or in working the ball out of defence.

Chance

Norwood had an ideal chance to grab an early lead but kicked 2-9 in the first term while the Tigers finished with 3-2.

But while the Redlegs struggled to meet the odds there were familiar patterns creeping into Glenelg's style.

"Rubber legged" Graham Cornes was in top form, Peter Carey and Kym Hodgeman continually worked as a successful duo, captain Paul Weston made the most of opportunity and centre half-back Michael Farquhar was brilliant.

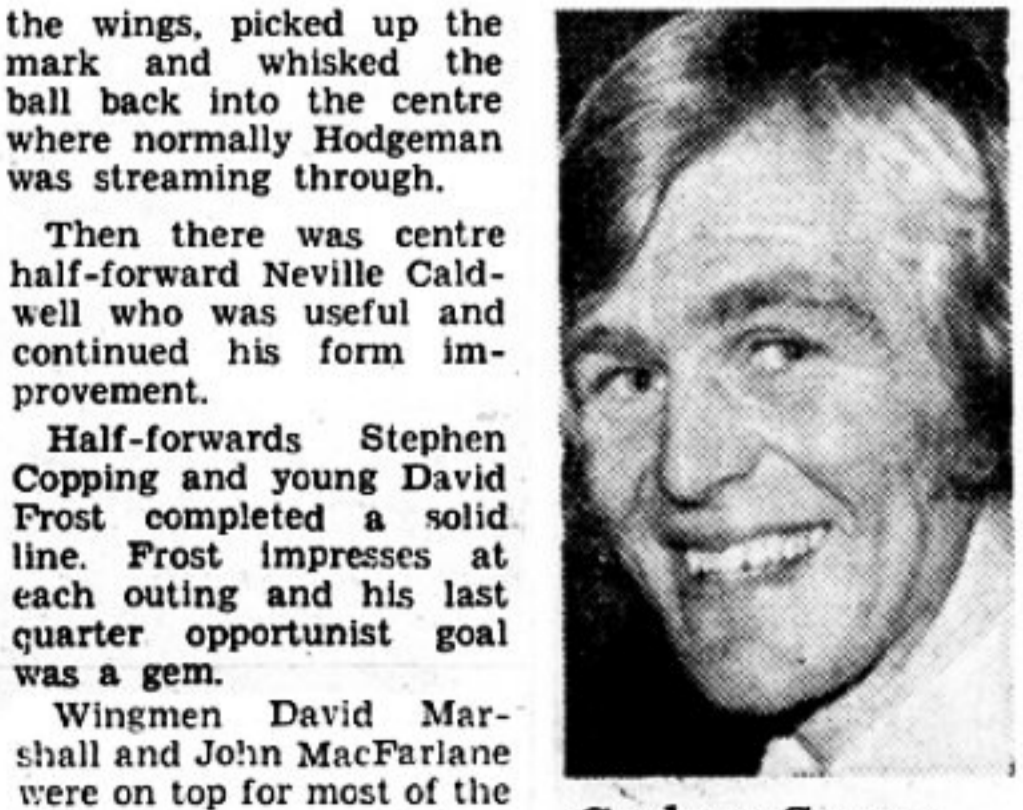
Farquhar was near impassable and finished with 22 kicks, five handballs and six marks.
