# Bays tear Roosters to shreds

## Glenelg 27-18, North 11-22.

Glenelg effectively strangled North Adelaide's cackling Roosters by 92 points at Prospect Oval yesterday.

The Tigers were far too good in every department and North resembled a second rate outfit which could appreciate the cricket season starting next week.

Glenelg virtually sealed up the ball game with an inspiring 11-goal second quarter which had North at a standstill, but outlined the power and pace of the forward and half-forward lines.

It was a term which Glenelg treated almost as a training run. But for early inaccuracies, there could have been more goals.

### Glimpses

North's only taste of glory was in the first quarter when it led by 23 points at the 16 minute mark.

But Glenelg quickly annulled the situation and kicked 7-2 to grab a six-point lead by the first change.

The Roosters seldom showed even glimpses of the form which almost upset Sturt at Football Park less than a week ago.

In fact it was hard to recognise it was the same team.

Once again the Tigers had many winners.

Follower Graham Cornes played his role to perfection and although not as spectacular as usual, produced a good team effort.

### Difficult

Big Peter Carey did his normal workman-like job in the ruck but in fact created more havoc with timely marks and goals when resting in the forward lines.

Wingman John McFarlane, half-forward Stephen Copping, forward pocket John Paynter and half forward Leon Twelftree were other players who made life difficult for North.

And then there was captain Paul Weston who, in his own destructive style, had an absolute field day in the centre.

### Plight

Centre half-forward Neville Caldwell continued to impress while rover Kym Hodgeman, playing his 149th game, were just two other Tigers who sealed victory.

Perhaps North's plight was exemplified in the final quarter by ruckman Greg Schlein.

He dived for a saving mark while "resting" in defence.

Schlein drove the ball forward to a team mate who dropped it.

Weston gratefully accepted the crumbs and booted a goal, over Schlein's head. It was no wonder he fell to his knees almost totally dispirited.

Schlein was one of North's better players and strove in ruck all day.

Centreman Barry Stringer and rover Mick Nunan were easily the Roosters' best.

Stringer got a host of touches and Nunan ran his short legs off and showed a giant heart.

Of the others, only wingman Trevor Hill could really be considered as a better player.
