# BIG PORT WINS IT

Port Adelaide held Glenelg at arms length for three quarters at Football Park yesterday before hitting it with a giant black-and-white sledgehammer in the last term to bolt away to a 51-point victory.

So effective was the Magpies' running game in the final term that even back pocket man Ivan Eckerman chipped in with a goal to add to the 8-4 kicked in that session.

Three of Glenelg's big guns in Carey, Cornes and Weston were only firing blanks yesterday and the rest — except Hodgeman and Copping—played accordingly.

Glenelg, with first use of the wind, controlled the game as Hodgeman scouted the ball beautifully and fed to the forwards precisely. But 1-6 after 15 minutes was a wasted effort.

## Control

Copping chipped in to help Hodgeman kick two goals before time on, but the Magpies' defence repelled the Bays' attack and rebounded magnificently through the bubbling, exciting movement of Clifford.

Three goals to Clifford, Evans and a great back up effort by half-backer Hofner in the time on period changed the whole pattern of the game to be only five points down at the first change.

Natt controlled the

rucks in the second term and for the rest of the game to set Clifford on his weaving way goalwards, while Cunningham also won telling touches.

Although roving the beaten rucks, Hodgeman took on the role of chief ball-getter no matter how big the opposition and at times resembled a bowling ball bouncing over rocks as he tried to lift his side.

There were few easy kicks won up to half time as the tackling was direct and meaningful with Port Adelaide showing a greater desire to win the ball.

Mark Williams at centre was the leading light in that department.

Seventeen points up at half time Port blocked off Glenelg's direct route to goal in the third term where Phillips powered Woite out of the play. Giles had the "no trespassing" sign up on his flank leaving the over-worked Copping the only Bay forward capable of causing penetration.

It wasn't enough. Seven points down at the last change with the wind in their face to come home was not a bright prospect for Glenelg.

And so it came to pass. Any brightness for Glenelg soon became a gloom as Port ran and ran to play a near perfect last term in kicking 8-4.

## Perfect

It's a toss up between Hodgeman and Clifford for the best on ground vote.

Hodgeman gets it very narrowly. He had to do it on his own practically, whereas Clifford had greater assistance, yet initiated countless profitable sorties.

Chris Natt mastered the Glenelg rucks, Mark Williams won centre and the hard ball all day while captain Cunningham eased back into top form.

For Glenelg—it was Hodgeman and Copping all day — then it became a case of too many doing too little for too long.
